



Drain ends at the N. of Lobdell Rd., between 5428 & 5468 Lobdell Rd.

Drain begins at the shore of Hoisington Lake.

Piped conveyance ends near this location, with discharges flowing through a small wetland complex before flows discharge to Hoisington Lake

- NOTES**
- The Orchard Park Drain is a combination of open (swales or ditches) & enclosed (pipe) conveyance, which also includes facilities that slow the flow to allow for nutrient uptake:
1. Original Orchard Park Retention Basin - this basin is being provided with an outlet, however it will still attenuate flows from the areas to the north prior to discharge.
 2. Apple Orchard - This area was designated for stormwater treatment when Apple Orchard Drive was built around 1980. It is being re-excavated as part of this project. Vegetation growth in this area will assist with nutrient uptake.
 3. Duck Pond - the water level in this area is designed to fluctuate several feet, which will accommodate a variety of plants to assist in nutrient uptake.
