The 2022 Audit review is underway don't expect a report until early May 2023 We are still low on fund and have to control our spending over the next few months.

BMO Business Proposal

We can have as many accounts as we need at no cost

The mortgage balance \$1,520,000 will be transferred to BMO at Prime +1.27 = 7.97% Monthly payment of \$5066.67 + interest. Currently we are paying \$10,151 and an interest of \$4,698.51. We are trying to get it amortized for 25 years, which will lower the payments. We can pay down the principle at any time with no fee.

The \$80,000 Operating Demand Loan interest at 6.7 + 0.29 = 7.99%. Currently it is 6.7 + 0.5 = 7.2%.

We can have two company credit cards for a total balance of \$25,000.

Cost of moving to BMO

Application Fee \$2,350.00

Paying of both the Branch & BMO legal fees approx. \$4,000.00. This cost can be covered by the first month's saving on our mortgage.

We have found a Lawyer willing to handle our legal requirements at a reduced rate.

From Comrade Dan Doyle – Edmonton Police Service (Ret'd)

A couple of things I would like to mention, this is not official because the Chief's Office never asked me to speak on this but a couple of people did.

The things that the Kingsway Legion did on behalf of the EPS that they were very impressed with include:

- 1. Lowering the flags It is well known that the Legion is a Federal organization not Provincial nor Municipal. However, being two doors down from the Northeast Division, they were very grateful to see the Legion's flags come down during the time that we were dealing with our issues.
- 2. The Legion allowed everyone to park here yesterday. At least 50% of the people were not from the Northeast division they were people who lived near by, and we were all told do not take your vehicle down to the Legislature as you will not be able to park. But the Legion jumped up and said "park your cars here and all the buses left from Northeast division to take us down to the Legislature and bring us back here. Which was awesome and everyone really appreciated this.
- 3. One of the most important things was the Legion was open, it was open to the public, open to the membership after the funeral ceremonies. It took longer than we thought as we had a lot more people show up to march, so took longer to get into Rogers Place, so in turn the funerals last longer. From our point of view we wanted to come back from there to here as soon as we could (Debbie & I) as is our home turf, as in volunteering and coming in as regulars here. We wanted to come back in our dress uniforms and spend our time here, unfortunately we had a lot of people from out of town police officers that we used to know in Edmonton moved into other departments, they had come into town and they wanted to see us. By the time we came back there were very few of you left here. But the ones we did speak with some retired people, they were very grateful to the Legion once again for once again opening your doors and hearts to us. Thank you very much.
