A Talk with the Padre

A Note from your Padre, Christmas, December 2023

Season's Greetings to each and everyone of you. And, as I do regularly, I say thank you for the privilege of allowing me to serve as your Padre, now going on six years. I would also take this time to extend to each and every one of you reading this, a blessed Christmas Season, as we spend time with family and friends, and hopefully take the time to commemorate the reason we set time aside to say thank you for the generosity and Love of Jesus who came down from His Home in Heaven to our earth, and ultimately surrender His life so we could by accepting that Gift, spend our eternity with Him. As we know Christmas is so much more than giving and receiving gifts, and that is important, getting together as family and friends over meals and drink, which is also very important. At the bases of all our celebration is the greatest gift of all, the Gift of the Christ Child, who came so we can live.

First the foretelling of His birth by the writer Isaiah in the book that bears his name: Isaiah 9:6, For to us a Child will be born. To us a Son, will be given. 




