Resolution supporting change in speed limit from 30 mph to 25 mph on Nebraska Avenue

As part of “Vision Zero” to improve traffic safety, the DC Department of Transportation (DDOT) has proposed to lower the speed limit on Nebraska Avenue between Macomb Street and Military Road from 30 mph to 25 mph.

ANC 3A has received the formal Notice of Intent from DDOT in NOI 24-02-TESD, dated January 30, 2024, notifying the Commission of the proposed change. DDOT has requested comments by March 13, 2024.

The portion of Nebraska Avenue covered by the proposed change includes all the blocks of Nebraska Avenue that form the western boundary of ANC 3A, from Massachusetts Avenue and Ward Circle to Wisconsin Avenue at Tenley Circle, as well as blocks in ANC 3D, 3E, and 3F.

DDOT has determined that this change is necessary and important in order to carry out the objectives of “Vision Zero” and meet transportation safety standards, based on federal guidelines and an analysis of traffic volumes, traffic speed data, crash history, the nature of the roadway and its overall context.

Safety is the #1 priority for DDOT, and public safety including on streets and sidewalks is also a top priority for the Advisory Neighborhood Commission as well.

Therefore be it resolved that ANC 3A supports the DDOT proposal to change the speed limit from 30 mph to 25 mph on Nebraska Avenue NW, in the blocks identified in NOI 24-02-TESD including the blocks in and adjoining ANC 3A.
