NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH

Watch Chair Cynthia Shaffer is pleased to report that crime has clearly been reduced in the neighborhood, thanks to the success and progress of the newly established Los Olivos-Riker Neighborhood Watch (LORNW). Networking of vigilant and observant neighbors via heavy e-mail contact regarding suspicious activity has been responsible for many crimes being avoided.

In addition, communication and cooperation with Eagle-Bison and Monterey Park neighborhood associations are helping to keep criminals from making inroads in the community.

Plans are being finalized for a *Crime Tip* blog to which residents can subscribe via the website. Subscribers will be immediately alerted as soon as anyone posts suspicious activity information.

A community safety awareness training program has been developed by law enforcement experts for residents interested in learning how to detect and deter criminal activities. Visit the LORNA website for details and announcements of future training dates.

LORNA leadership is proud to have participated in National Night Out in Salinas on August 3rd. NNO is a unique crime/drug prevention event sponsored by the National Association of Town Watch and is designed to strengthen neighborhood spirit and police-community partnerships.

CITIZEN PATROL

The LORNW Citizen Patrol has hit the streets and is out in full force watching and listening! Look for the vests with the LORNA logo, introduce yourself to the patrollers, and thank them for helping keep the community safe.

The *Guide to Citizen Patrol*, diligently authored by Watch Co-Chair Don Jones, has been completed and published. This comprehensive guide is designed to provide personal safety and guidance for citizens who patrol their neighborhoods. The guide will soon be available for viewing on the website.

Monterey Park's Civilian Patrol sponsors and hosts patrol training. LORNA strongly encourages anyone who wishes to be part of Citizen Patrol to go through the training. The next training session, hosted by Monterey Park, is scheduled for November 6th. Visit the LORNA website for details.
