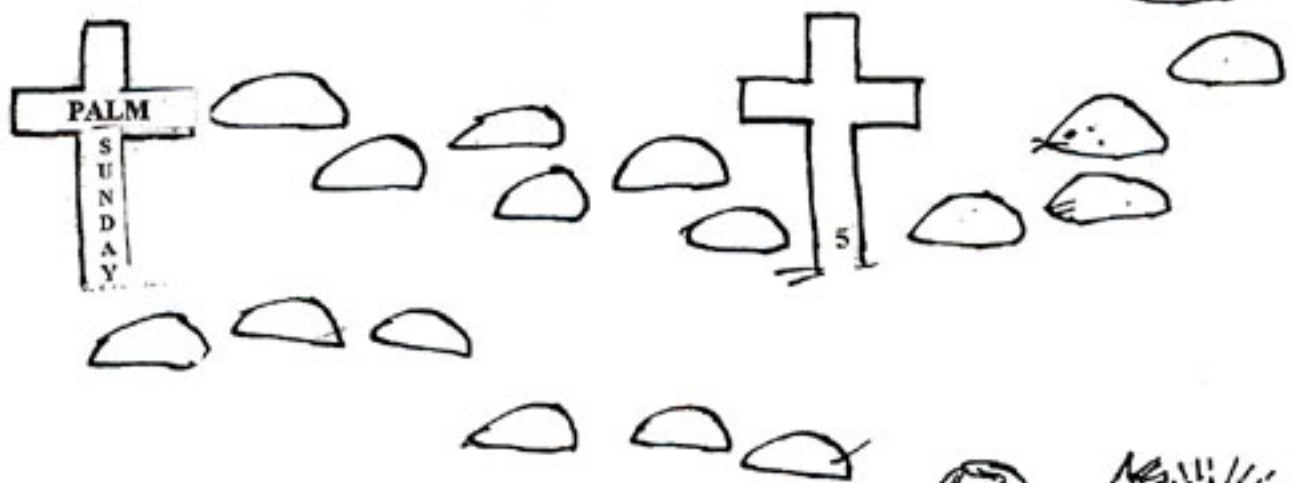


LENT - THE WAY TO CONVERSION

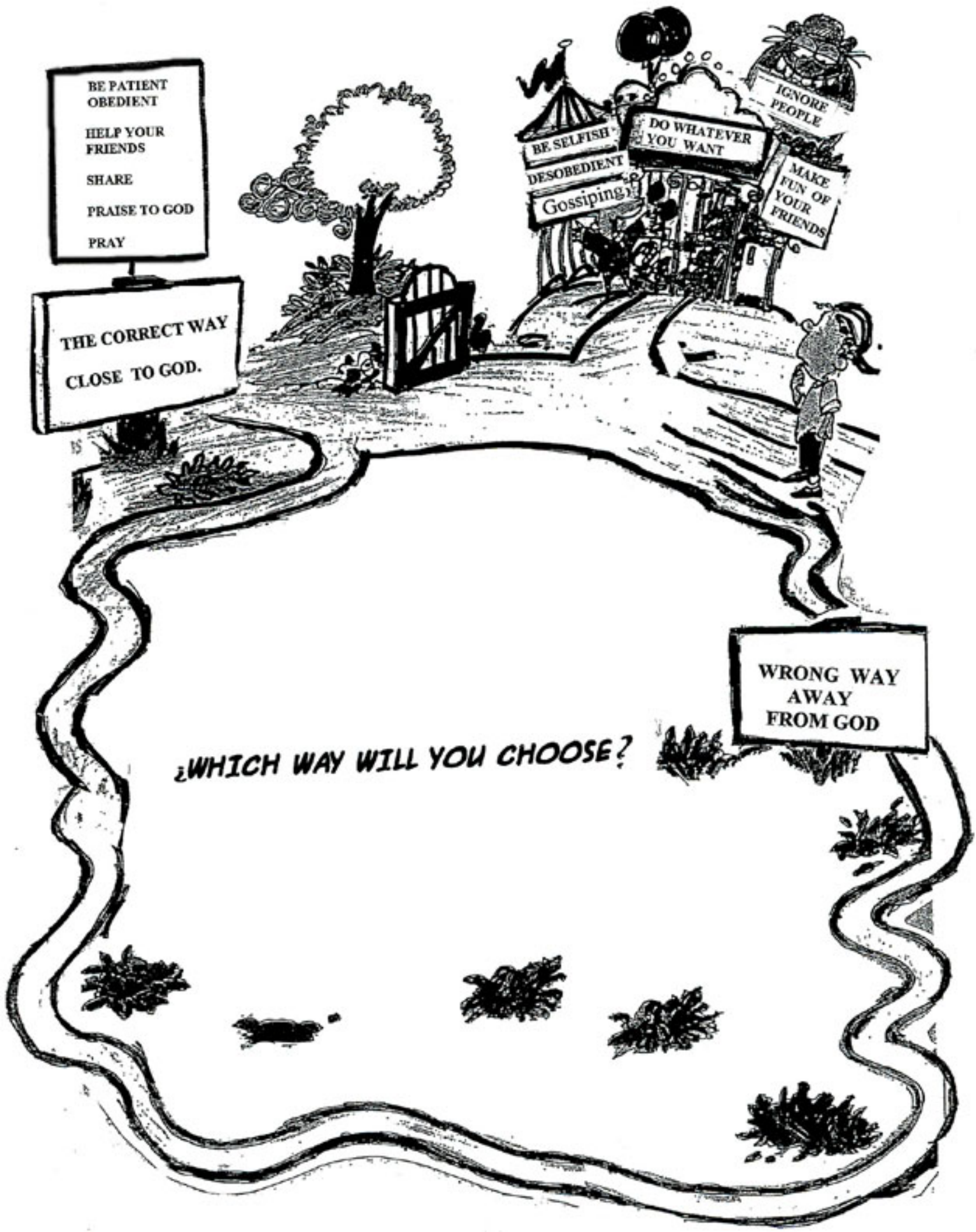

Jesus gives sight to a blind man

I Sam. 16:1,6-7, 10-13;
Eph. 5:8-14;
John 9:1-41

Talk about the story. Talk with the children about blindness. Do they know anyone who is blind? What difficulties do blind people have? What do adults mean when they say that the worst blindness is that of a person who doesn't want to see? Do we sometimes prefer not to see something because it is ugly or painful, or because it makes us do uncomfortable things? Are any of the children afraid of the dark?

Activities. Try to darken the room as much as possible and ask the children to walk around. If you can't darken the room, ask for a volunteer. Blindfold him or her, and ask the child to walk around the room. What are the obstacles? Discuss how difficult it must be for blind people to do things that may seem very ordinary for the rest of us.

Final prayer. Turn on the lights. As the children express their commitment to be light, give each one a votive candle. All respond: "Jesus, you are our light." They should enter into the church carrying their lights.

You are there.

Do you think Jesus should have waited until the following day instead of breaking the rules? Do you believe that Jesus healed the blind man with a little mud? What do people around you say? Why were the parents of the blind man afraid?

Speak to Jesus and tell him how you sometimes don't know what is the best thing to do. Ask him for the help to see and to be light for others by your good example. Tell him what you want to do this week.

Jesus raises Lazarus from the dead

March 13:
5th Sunday in
Lent

Exek. 37:12-14;
Rom. 8:8-11;
Jphn 11:1-45

Talk about the story. Speak with the children about the story. How do they imagine the situation? Have they experienced death in their family? How did the adults react? What words of comfort did they hear? Have they ever gone to give condolences to someone? How did that feel? What do they think of Lazarus' story and his coming out of the tomb? Is that possible?

Activities. Dramatize the resurrection of Lazarus, who has been dead for four days. As he comes out the tomb and everyone is amazed, what do people say? What does Lazarus say? What other favors do people start to ask Jesus?

Final prayer. Have each child write about a difficult problem in his or her life or family that he or she would like to lift up to Jesus. As they place them on a tray, all say: "Jesus, you are life".

You are there

Do you think, like Martha and Mary, that Jesus can raise Lazarus? The smell will be awful. Do you stand back or stay to see what will happen next?

What do people say and do when they see Lazarus come out?



Q: Jesus is able to do the impossible. He even raises his good friend Lazarus from the dead. Do you have some problems that seem impossible to solve? Do you turn to Jesus or your family or friends for help?

Jesus, your friend, invites you:

Jesus, shows that he has the power to solve the most impossible things. Do you trust Jesus to help you when you think things have no solution?

What am I going to do?

Speak with Jesus and tell him something, that worries you and that seems very, very difficult to solve. Tell him you know he can help you want to do.

- For example: When I am afraid, I will speak to Jesus, knowing he is with me.
- For example: I will comfort someone who is sad because a loved one, a relative, or a friend, as died.

Jesus enters Jerusalem

March: 20:
Palm Sunday

Matt. 21:1-11;

Talk about the story. Why would it be that people praise Jesus one day and then ask for his execution a few days later? Have the children met people who betray those whom they say are their friends? Why would that be?

Activities. Dramatize the scene of Jesus' entrance into Jerusalem with palms. At the Preparation of the Gifts, children can make a procession with palms, singing Hosanna.

Final prayer. How will we praise Jesus every day of this week? Each child can express a commitment. All answer: "Blessed are you, Jesus".

Jesus beats death

March 27:
Easter Sunday

Acts:10:34, 37-43;
Col. 3:1-4;
John 20:1-9

Talk about the story. Ask the children to imagine the scene. Who is the young man? Who could have rolled the stone away from the entrance to the tomb? How would they react if they were there? Are there situations in their lives that they think have no solutions?

Activities. Discuss any current events the children might have heard on TV or seen in the newspaper that many have bothered them. As a class, pray for each of these current events and ask for the power of the Resurrection of Jesus to come upon them.

Final prayer. Bring cascarones (eggs shells filled with colorful confetti) to class. Cascarones are a symbol of the empty tomb of Jesus—empty but full of life and joy. Ask the children to crack the shells on each other's heads. As they do, all sing the song for the week.

Jesus, your friend, invites you:

After Jesus' death, his friends were afraid of what might happen to them. What frightens you? By his resurrection, Jesus shows that evil and death are not the end of the story. What difficult situations do you see in your family and neighborhood? Do you think Jesus can help?



Q Jesus has risen from the dead. Jesus' Resurrection gives us the hope and courage to go on when we have problems. What difficulties are you facing right now? Do you trust that Jesus will help you when things seem very difficult?

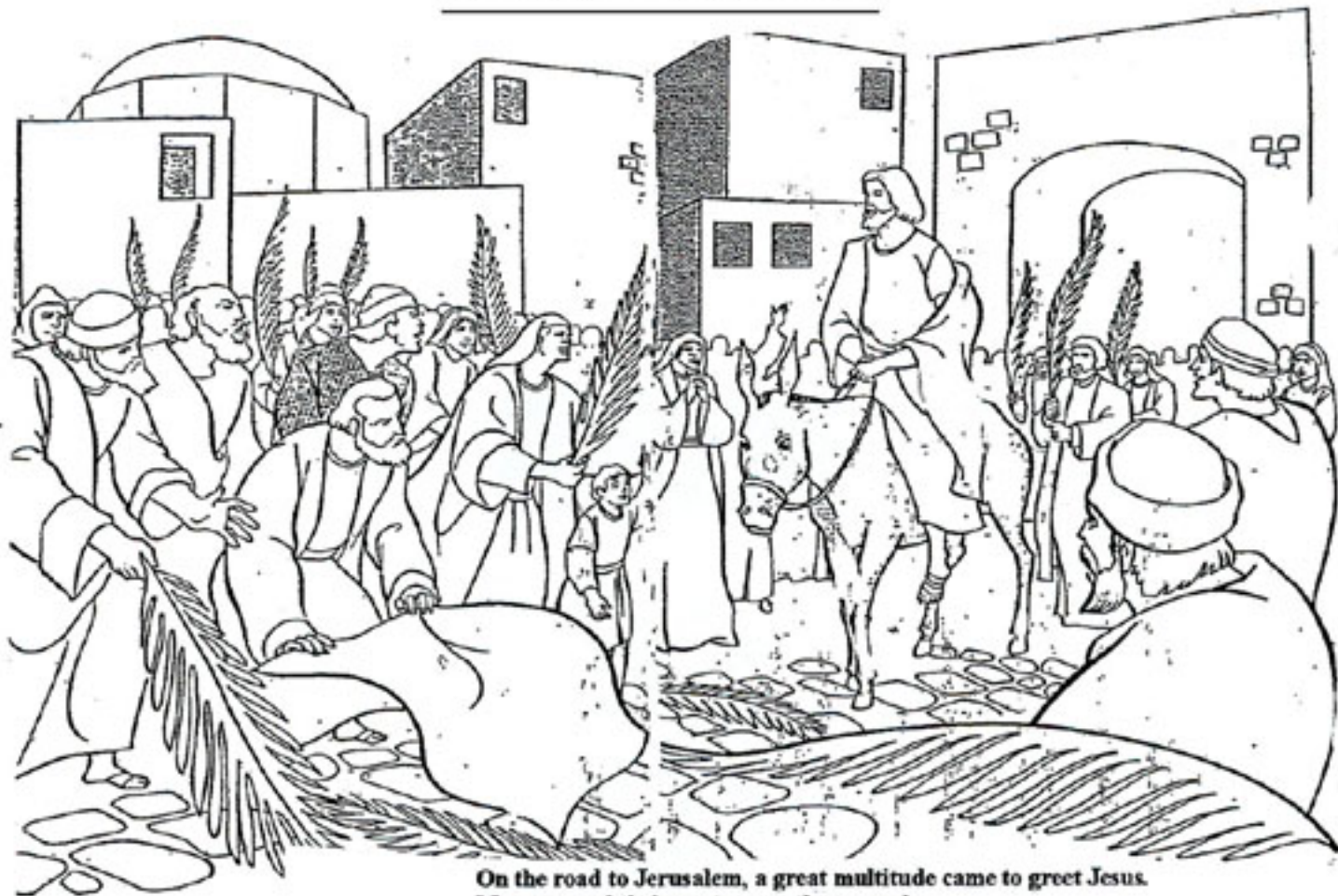

PALM SUNDAY



On the road to Jerusalem, a great multitude came to greet Jesus. Many spread their coats upon the ground. While others waved palm branches in the air. And the people began to rejoice and to praise God.

The STORY of this Feast...

A whole crowd of men and women and children went out from Jerusalem to meet Jesus in Bethany. The disciples put some of their clothes upon the back of a colt for a saddle for Jesus to ride upon.

The large crowd spread their cloaks on the road, while some of them began to cut branches from the trees and spread them on the road.

The people were all shouting: "Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed be He who comes in the Name of the Lord!"

When the parade reached Jerusalem, all the people came out of their houses to see the crowd waving palm branches. "Who is this?" people asked. "This is Jesus the Prophet" replied the crowd, "the Man from Nazareth in Galilee!"

The MEANING of this Feast...

Jesus entered Jerusalem to show that He wanted to rule over the souls of men. He should reign as King in our own heart and life.

Palm Sunday is the beginning of Holy Week.

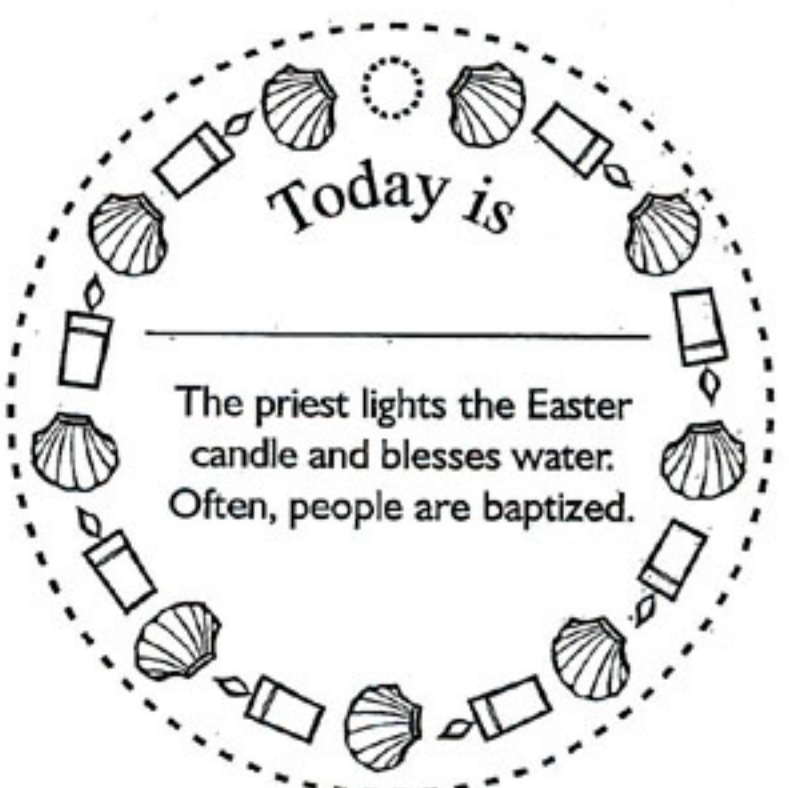

JESUS IN THE TABERNACLE

But, why do we keep Jesus in the tabernacle after celebrating mass?

We do it for three reasons:

1. **to take Him to the Christians who were not able to attend the Eucharist because they are sick.** They also need the strength and grace of Jesus

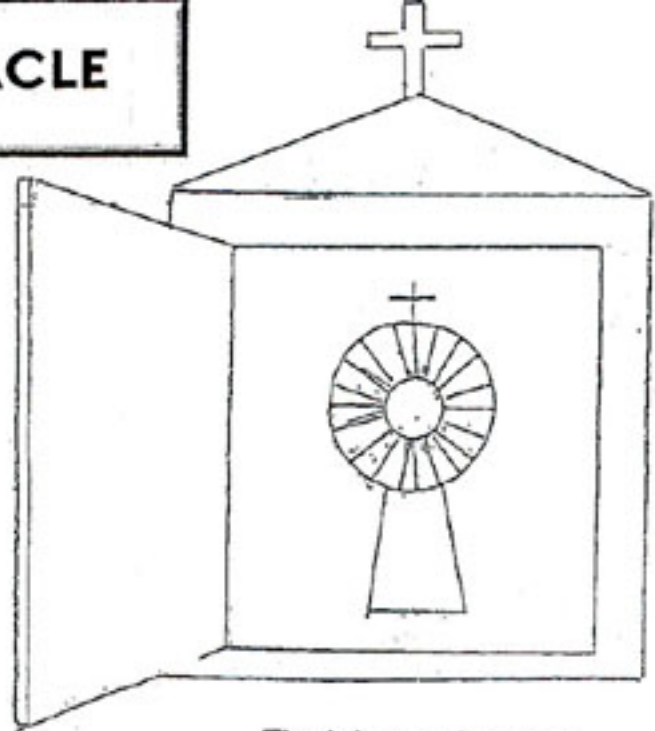
2. **To take Him to those who are going to die.** This is called the "Viaticum". This is the best help that we can have for our journey from this world to God. It is the best nourishment and the greatest strength at this very important time.

3. **So that we may adore Him and come to Him in prayer.** To adore Jesus in the Eucharist is to acknowledge that He is God. It is not a piece of bread, but the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ, the second person of the most Holy Trinity.

We should also come to Him to thank Him.

for all He gives us; to ask Him what we need; to listen to Him because He speaks to our hearts and to ask His forgiveness for all the wrong we do.

In short, to speak with Him.



The tabernacle is the little house of Jesús. It is in the church. Whenever Jesus is there, the lamp will be lit..... Look for it

Jesus, from "His little house" in the Tabernacle:

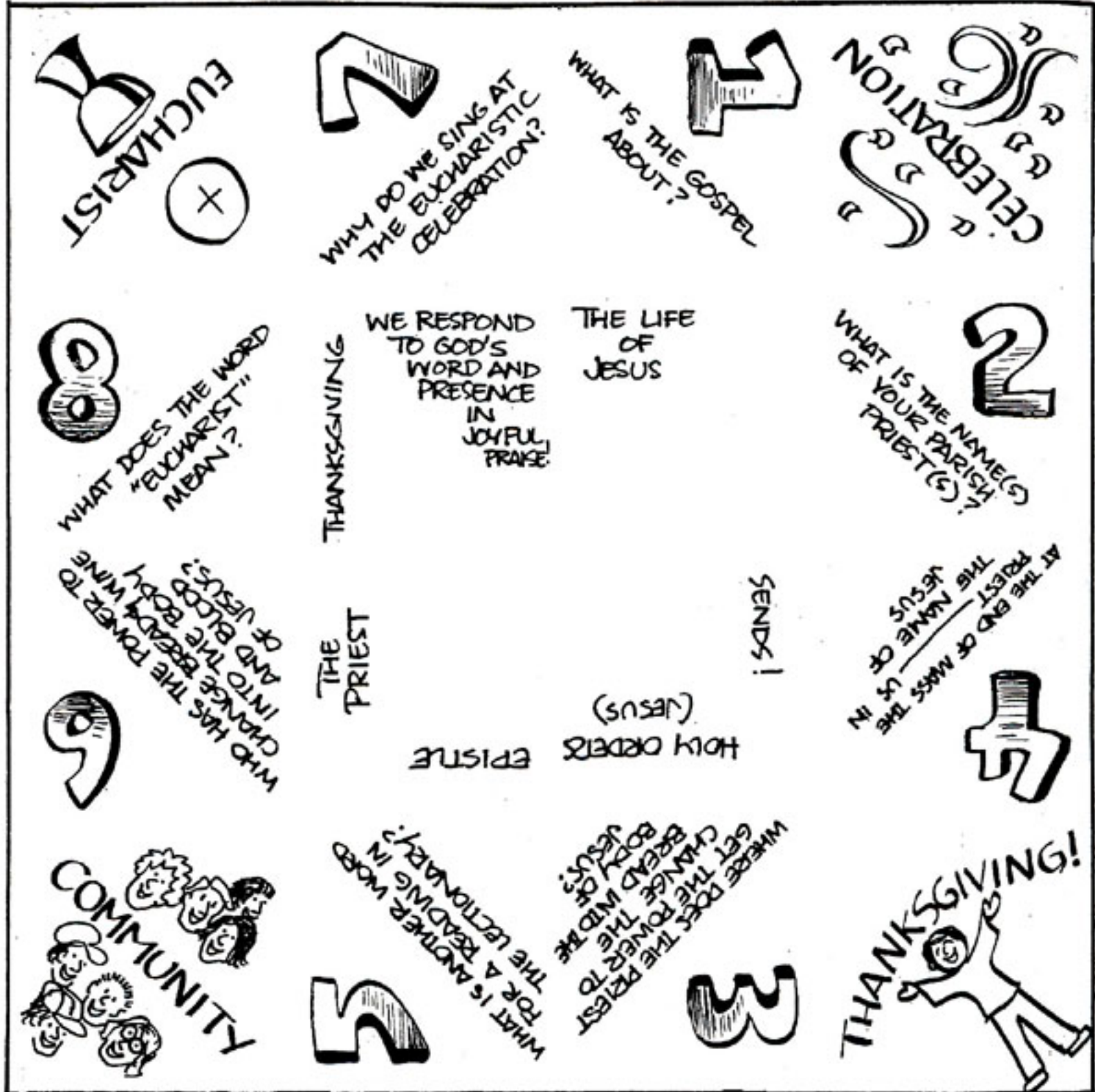

He will show you how to be a better altar server, not only when you help with Holy mass, but also during your lifetime.



Cut out the square. Fold it in half; unfold. (Pictures outside. Then fold it in half in the other direction; unfold. Fold four corners into center, —one at a time—(keep folded). Turn square over to other side, fold corners again into center (keep folded), then fold square lengthwise in half; unfold. Fold square in other direction in half; unfold. Now place fingers into four corner pockets underneath with numbers facing up (forefinger and thumb of both hands) and push them together toward the center to fold over numbers.

your right hand to the right—forefinger and thumb of your left hand to the left—another inner area of numbers appears. Practice opening up in both directions.

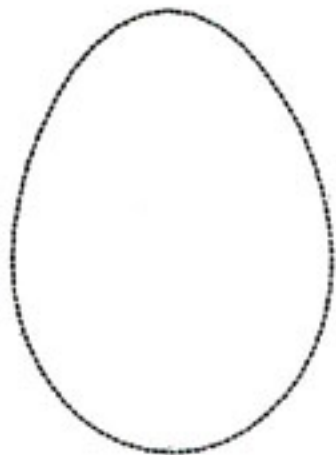
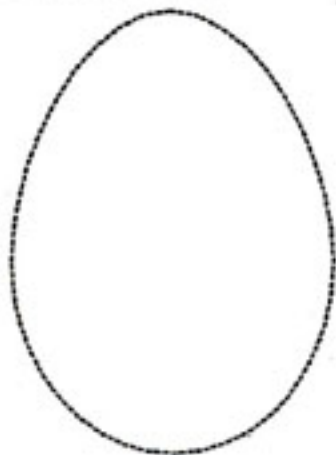
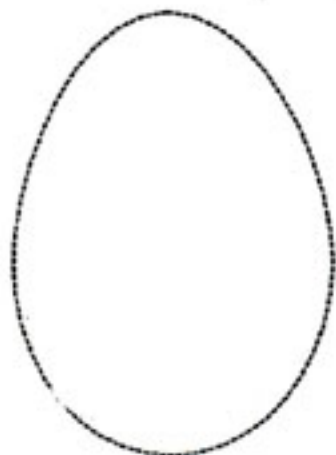
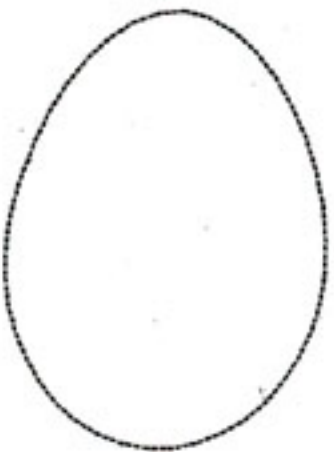
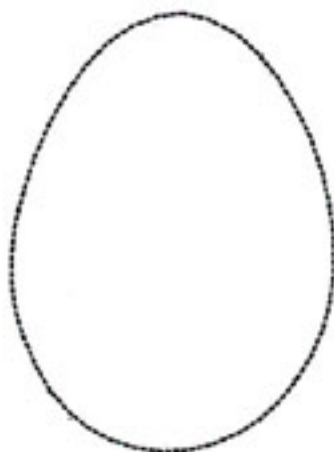
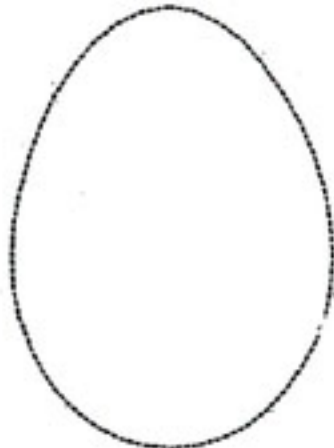

Make an Easter basket to give to a parent, grandparent, or friend. This basket will carry your good wishes to a special person this Easter.

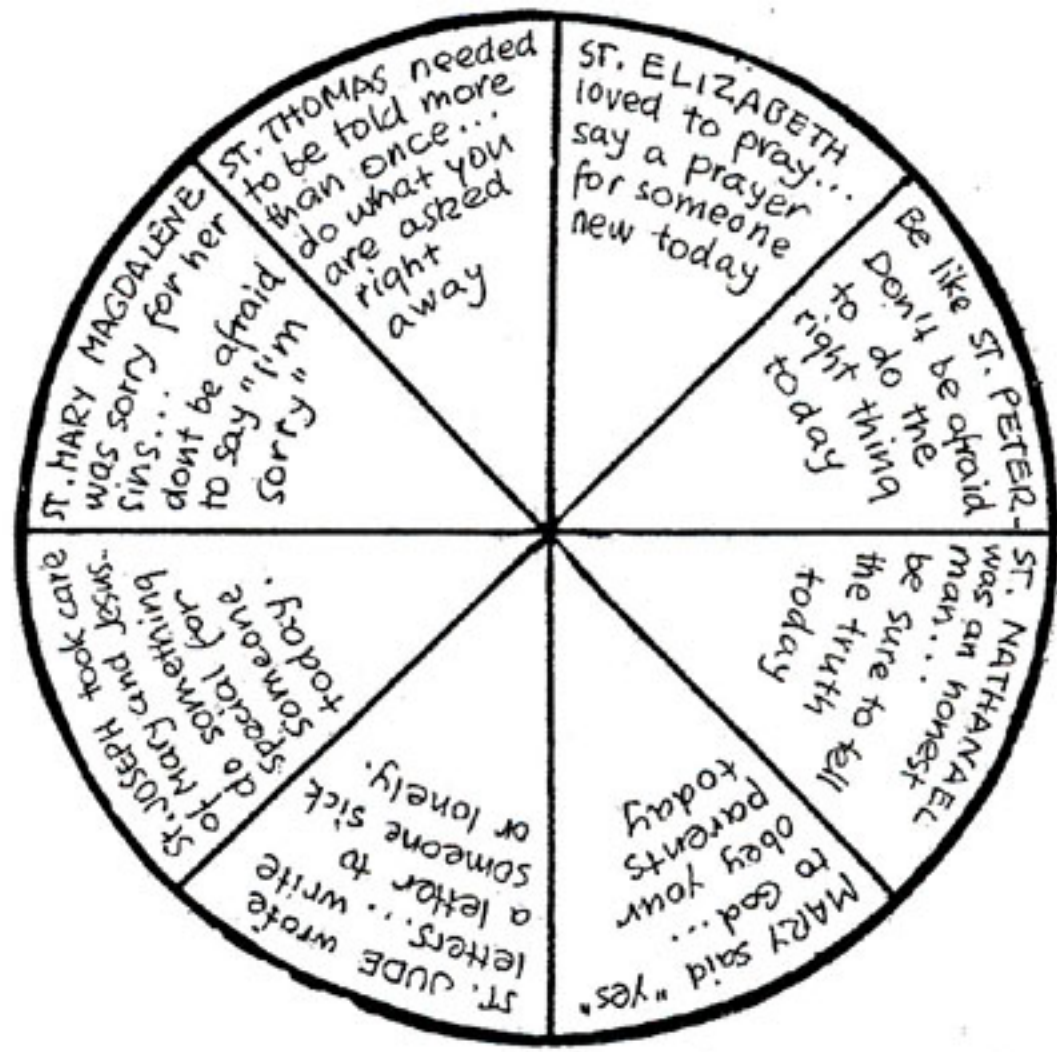
1. Color the basket.
2. Cut around the basket on the dotted lines.
3. Cut along the dotted line on the inside of the basket. Be careful not to cut through the handles of the basket.
4. Paste or tape an 8½" x 11" piece of paper behind the basket. Use paste or tape only on the outside edges so that your basket has an open pocket. This will let you put your eggs in the basket.



On each of the eggs, write a special message to the person who will get the egg. You might want to tell the person why you like him or her so much. You might also tell about some good things you plan to do for that person. Color or decorate the eggs, cut them out, and put them in the basket you have already made. Your Easter basket is ready to deliver!
