

I hope everyone enjoyed the presentation from Beth Donaldson. Let's hope we can plan a road trip again to visit the MSU museum.

Michelle May from Raspberry Rabbits will be our guest speaker for November. There is still room to join us for the Beekeeper Pincushion workshop on Saturday, Nov. 18. Member cost is \$55.00 and for non-members the cost is \$65.00. This fee covers the class registration and all materials. The only thing you need to bring to class are two pair of scissors. One small, sharp pointed pair, like the stork embroidery scissors and one regular pair. The kits Michelle brings include needles, wool, and even a thimble. I'm excited to have her attend our guild.

January's workshop is Thread Painting by Jan Berg-Rezmer. The cost for members is \$35.00 and Non-members is \$45.00. Once you register I will email you a supply list. We need a minimum of six people in order to hold the class.

On March 15, 2018, Donna Kooistra from Lagrange, Indiana, will give an interactive lecture called "Everybody Wins!" about appraising quilts. Donna is an AQS Certified Appraiser. She is also willing to schedule a day following her lecture to do appraisals. In order to hold this, we need to guarantee five written appraisals for her on that day. Donna charges \$60 per written appraisal and \$30 per verbal consultation. If you wish to have a written appraisal (for insurance purposes) on a quilt, I need to have a response from you by the December meeting to have her stay a second day to do appraisals. Please inform me by email if you wish to have a written appraisal and I will have a signup sheet at November's meeting.

CAMEO Fabric Exchange

Fabric Exchanges are a perfect way to add variety to your fabric stash and to stretch your creativity. It's so much fun to see what great fabric finds you will go home with.

This year we will be exchanging 10 1/2 inch squares of fabric. Each month we will announce a theme for the next month's meeting and CAMEO members will be invited to participate. Sign up only for the months you wish to participate. You can jump in - or out - at any time! (But we hope you will jump in and stay in - more fabric for everyone!)

Here's how it works. Each month we will announce the theme for next month. There will be a sign up sheet and members will be asked to sign up before the Hospitality break. During the second half of the meeting we will announce the number of participants. The following month each participant will bring in 2 (10-1/2") squares for each person in the swap. (Example: If 10 sign up then each person must bring in 20 (10-1/2") squares to the next meeting.) We will even tell you how much fabric you will need for each exchange.

Here are a few simple rules for the exchange:

- Quilt Shop Quality fabric only please (see article below)
- Fabric may be washed or unwashed
- Drop off fabric at beginning of the meeting and pick up fabric during Hospitality Break
- Sign-up for following month's exchange at the Hospitality Break
- Fabric not picked up will be saved until the next meetina
- People who forget to bring their fabric do not participate in the exchange for that month and will not be able to bring that month's fabric in the next month.

Here's a sneak peek at the monthly themes:

November 2017 - Winter December 2017 - NO EXCHANGE January 2018 - Celestials February 2018 - Solids March 2018 - Ugly Fabric April 2018 - Civil War May 2018 - All American June 2018 - NO EXCHANGE



WHY "QUILT SHOP QUALITY" FABRIC?

Speaking of fabrics, did you know that all fabric is not created equally? There is craft fabric, sewing fabric, and quilting cottons.

Quilt quality fabric is made of cotton and is tightly woven. If you hold it up to the light you will not be able to see between the thread weaves. That dense weave allows the fabric to live longer and the dyes take better to the fabric. You'll find less fray, less shrinkage, less bleeding and your final quilt will last much longer. The best bet for buying appropriate fabric is to frequent your local quilt store.

Fabric Exchange for November

Our **November theme is "Winter."** From snow flakes to polar bears and every wintery thing in between, if it makes you think "brrr, cold, winter," then you've got it. Here are the brave souls who are weathering our first Exchange:

Nine people signed up for November so each person will bring 18 (10.5") squares to the November meeting. The total amount of fabric needed for this exchange is 1.5 (one and one half) yards.



Theme: CAMEO Revelations - make a quilt featuring a cameo!

Cost: None to participants.

Fabric: Participant's choice. Use your own fabric, new or from stash. The guild will not be supplying any fabric.

Timeline: The challenge will be presented at the November, 2017 guild meeting. A sign up sheet will be available at the March and April, 2018 guild meetings. Quilts are to be brought early to the May guild meeting. Voting will be by the members present at the May, 2018 meeting.

Rules: the cameo (of any shape, not our Guild logo) may be pieced, appliquéd or a combination; embroidery and/or embellishments may be added. Quilt must have a cameo made from fabric or embroidery; attaching a cameo does not meet criteria. The finished quilt must be at least 12" x 12" and may not exceed 144" around the perimeter. It may be any shape. Quilts will be measured to determine eligibility for prizes. Finished quilt should be completed, quilted, bound and labeled. Use your original design; using someone else's pattern defeats the purpose of a challenge. Challenge committee members are not excluded from participation.

Prizes: To be determined - You are guaranteed the satisfaction of challanging yourself!

- The Emergency Fan-Out Committee (EFOC) is a subcommittee under Communications. Although it is considered an optional Special Committee, it is necessary to communicate the cancellation of a general meeting or workshop. It may also be used to call a general meeting. Our goal is to streamline this procedure while keeping it as accurate and timely as possible. Simpler is better!
- 2. All decisions to cancel a general meeting or workshop reside with the Guild President who confers with the Executive Board. Cancellation should be made before 4:00 p.m. of the day of a general meeting and before the start of a scheduled workshop.
- The President generates a global text message to the guild membership (and EFOC) announcing the cancellation. Members chose to receive these text messages when they filled out their annual membership forms.
- The webmaster is responsible for placing this cancellation on the guild website and Facebook page as soon as possible.
- 5. Other guild members chose to be notified by phone call or email, rather than by text messaging. This secondary notification is the duty of the Emergency Fan-Out Committee. No piece of paper can be folded more than seven times. A master list for this purpose was compiled by the Membership V.P.
- 6. There is a smaller number of members who do not participate in text messaging, so the Emergency Fan-Out Committee may be comprised of one person. This year **Sandy Peiss** will be handling Emergency Fan-Out for those members requiring a phone call or email notification.

Research and Information NAMETAGS, THE ART OF

After 72 years, sometimes there is a slight jumble in the upstairs attic (mine). Facial recognition is a positive, but occasionally the name recognition takes a while to come up! That's where you, my fellow quilting sisters and brothers come in to focus. THE NAMETAG!!

You are usually as familiar to me as my children's names. However, my kids will tell you that sometimes "Steve" and "Mike" come out as "SMike." Another time I called one son by all three children's names, including our daughter and "Friday", our dog! Now that's very bad. My son has 4 girls – whoa, you get the picture.

The revised Bylaws do not require us to wear nametags at meetings, but give me a little help, please, and wear one!

Have some fun making a nametag, try using your "creative imagination." Do you have a favorite block you used in a quilt? Reduce it and make a mini square, add a square of batting, pop on a backing, turn it, write or embroider you name, pin it on, and voila, A NAMETAG! Sew a strap on the top sides, and you can hang it around your neck. Make a "chatelaine," add your name, and wear around your neck. Remember, simple is good too.

I have had fun making nametags for various occasions, mostly when I was a member of Michigan Quilt Network. We usually had a theme for our yearly retreats. Well, there you go – another nametag. One year during a CAMEO Retreat we were taught how to make collars. Our name was put on by a generous member, and there was lots of room for quilt pins. (I have the pattern.)

Just a little side note from my days of public speaking: if wearing a nametag, pin it on your left shoulder side. If you observe, when shaking hands or greeting someone, the viewer's eye focus goes automatically to her right. It looks like you are looking at them. If you look to the left at a nametag, it appears you are looking over the person's shoulder. How about that?

Ah, yes, a nametag. Have fun with this – there is no "incorrect". Play around, and make sure the name is easy to read. It sure would help this 72 year old sister quilter. I will try to bring some of my nametags I had fun making to the next meeting. Enjoy!

Rosemary Spatafora moved to accept the minutes from the September general meeting and Linda Griffin seconded the motion. The membership accepted the minutes as written.

Charity announcement by Linda Wallace: Haven bag kits are available for pick up at the Charity table. They need to be sewn, filled and returned by the November general meeting. - •March, 2018 Donna Koostra, quilt appraiser, will have an interactive lecture. She is available to make quilt appraisals the following Saturday during National Quilting Day sew-in. Must register for 1-hour appointments. More information to be in the newsletter.

Membership VP, Susan Larson: two members renewed and we had 1 guest tonight. Total memberships is at 51. All members to pick up their directories from the membership table. See Susan Larson if you need to change a committee assignment.

Audit report, Theresa Nielsen: All books are in order for the 2016-17 guild year. Membership accepted the audit.

CAMEO Quilters Guild Executive Board Meeting Minutes October 26, 2017 home of President Cindy May

Meeting was held at Cindy May's House. Meeting was called to order by at 7:10 p.m.

Present: Cindy May, Barb Lusk, Linda Ibbs, Loreen Garrison, Karla Sutton, Susan Larson, Pat Beldauf, Laurie Johnson, Sharon Cratsenburg, and Kathy Wilson

Minutes from the September, 2017 Board meeting were approved, signed, dated and placed on file.

All Committee manuals have been passed to the liaisons, except for the Audit book which will go out in January, 2018.

BUDGET: The proposed budget was submitted by Treasurer Pat Baldauf and Assistant Treasurer Cheryl Cawley which was reviewed. A revised budget will be provided to the membership at the November general meeting.

EDUCATION: CAMEO will be demonstrating the process of quilting in March at the request of Beaumont Hospital. Cathy Mentkowski to coordinate.

NEWSLETTER ADS: We are looking for additional advertisements for the CAMEO newsletter. There is only one paid ad in November's newsletter. It was noted that the paid advertisements pay for the cost of the newsletter.

CHARITY: A concern was noted that few members are picking up charity packets during Guild meetings. It was suggested that a reminder for charity quilts be announced at meetings. Cutting and sewing days have been done outside of quilt guild.

Discussed additional charities to support for 2017-18 guild year. Additionally, a motion was made by Barb Lusk to donate \$100 to each of the following charities (as the guild had not addressed this at the June, 2017 Board meeting): Clawson United Methodist Church, Vista Maria, Haven, Lions/Bear's Camp, and MSU's Quilt Museum. Sharon Cratsenburg seconded the motion. The motion was approved unanimously. Money to come from the 2018-19 budget.

A motion was also made by Laurie Johnson to donate \$200 in supplies to fill the Haven bags due at the November meeting. Seconded by Kathy Wilson. The motion was approved unanimously. Chair Linda Wallace will be contacted by Kathy Wilson to find out what is needed for the bags.

CHALLENGE THEME will be "Cameo Revelations." Prizes to be determined as this is now an "Activity" (per the Bylaw revisions), which does not require funds from the budget.

MEMBERSHIP: There have been two membership renewals in October. It was suggested that there be a Welcome Tea for new members. Suggested it be held on a Monday/Tuesday at a member's home. All new members from last year and current year will be invited along with a few long-time members in order to help integrate new members into the guild.

LIBRARY: Loreen Garrison, committee liaison, requested an electronic file of the library books. President will send the electronic file to her. Table space during guild meetings for the library was requested. It was suggested that books be placed on the "Door Prize" side of the room, so as not to be confused with "Fabulous Finds". Current Library chair is having health problems and may not be available regularly.

OPEN SEW: there were 12 people in attendance for the Open Sew last week.

PROGRAMS for 2018-19: Loreen Garrison has found speakers for the 2018-19 Guild year and asked for approval to book:

- October, 2018 Anico Feher lecture approved at \$350, workshop approved \$550. The workshop will be on pattern making for picture quilts. Suggested class price of \$50 for members, \$60 for guests with a maximum of 20 students.
- November 2018: John Putnam will provide a trunk show with 30 or so quilts. He defines his presentation as "Show and Tell and Laugh." No workshop. Cost is \$200 plus mileage. Board approved this speaker.
- January, 2019: Lauri Miller Designs Trunk Show, modern and traditional. \$200 cost Approved.
- February, 2019: Whistle Stop and Charity Day.
- March, 2019: Janet Miller, City Stitcher Trunk Show and Lecture \$150, Motel \$75. No workshop due to National Quilting Day.
- April, 2019: Trunk Show by Ruth Ann Berry \$150; Workshop: Isometric 3-D Quilt \$350.
- May, 2019: Pam Achatz \$300.00 and hotel room.

FUNDRAISING/QUILT SHOW: There are CAMEO pins still in stock. It was suggested that these pins be made available to newer members for their nametags. Discussed if these should be sold or freely distributed. A decision was not made at this meeting since more information on the original cost needs to be researched.

QUILT SHOW: CAMEO's 25th anniversary year will start in November 2019. Cindy May suggested we do our next quilt show in the spring of 2020 (a three year cycle) since that will be in the middle of our 25th Anniversary year. Proposal to be presented to membership at November's general meeting for a vote held at the December meeting. It was suggested that an Anniversary Raffle Quilt be done as a fund raiser. A suggestion was made that perhaps two quilts could be done. One for a membership raffle and a second to be raffled to the general public at the show. State license allows 2 quilts on one license.

We have received a letter from the state licensing commission that they are going "on line". This will make it easier for us to obtain the license needed when we sell raffle tickets in the future.

EMAILS TO MEMBERSHIP: As a response to a request made by a member to reduce the risk of email hacking, from now on the email addresses will be placed in bcc: (blind copies) so that they will not be seen.

Meeting adjourned at: 10:10 p.m.
