

Maple Bacon Crack submitted by Pat Baldauf

1 lb. bacon 1 pkg. crescent rolls 1/2 C maple syrup 3/4 C brown sugar

Preheat oven to 325. Line rimmed baking sheet with foil or parchment. Liberally grease with cooking spray. Unroll crescent rolls into a single sheet and press seams together. Stretch dough out to fit pan. Prick all over with fork. Set aside.

Cut up bacon and cook until about half done and not quite crisp. Drizzle 1/3 c of maple syrup over dough, sprinkle with about 3/4 c brown sugar, then top with bacon. Drizzle the with the rest of the maple syrup and sprinkle the rest of the brown sugar over the top.

Bake for approximately 25 minutes until bubbling and caramelized. Remove from the oven and allow to come to room temperature. Cool completely before cutting into pieces. Enjoy!



Are you familiar with the traditional block Puss-in-the-Corner? It has been around since the early 1900s but I had never heard of it until the name caught my attention. It is essentially an uneven 9 patch and has had many names and variations. It was the block of the day on October 13th for the online series I am doing: www.365challenge.com.au. It is organized by Kathryn Kerr in Australia. Every day she presents a new block, gives a little history, and instructions for making the block. So, let me introduce you to Puss-in-the-Corner.

Early variations of Puss-in-the-Corner:

Nancy Cabot published some of these versions in the Chicago Tribune during the 1930s.







9" finished quilt block

- 1. Background fabric
 - Cut 12 squares each 2 1/2". Cut 8 squares 2 1/8" and bisect on one diagonal.
- 2. Accent fabric 1 Cut centre square 4 1/2".
- 3. Accent fabric 2 Cut 8 squares 2 1/8" and bisect on one diagonal.

Announcements - Cheryl Cawley announced and explained the new monthly Fabric Exchange that she will be organizing. Exchange will be 10 1/2" squares each month. Members may sign up at tonight's meeting. Cheryl will include an article in the newsletter.

Quilts from Peggy Grunow's estate were displayed on the stage for any interested member to purchase.

Minutes from October 27 Board meeting approved. Signed, dated & placed on file. Mail was distributed.

Sharon Cratsenburg - reported on possible speakers and programs for 2017/18. It was suggested that CAMEO may want to join with another guild for a speaker/program.

Membership: Shannon Boardman - Two new members have brought our membership to 55. Vanetta Sterling will handle the Membership table in December. Cindy will take the Membership materials to the meeting. Shannon will update the membership email list and the directory.



MYSTERY QUILT - November Clue #2

Block A Construction: as tempting as it is, do NOT square up your finished block until the NEXT episode of clues!

CLUE 1: Positon the half square triangle that was cut from the 3 inch square with the corner at the top right. The slant of the triangle should descend from the top left to the bottom right.

Align the top edge of the 5" Medium rectangle to the corner side of the Background triangle. Sew with a quarter inch seam. Press the seam allowance toward the triangle. Repeat to make 4, 36 or 48 units.



CLUE 2: Sew the 5" Dark rectangle to the remaining short side of the triangle unit with one end of the rectangle extending over the 5" Medium rectangle. Press the seam allowance toward the triangle. Repeat 4, 36 or 48 times.



CHOOSE YOUR MYSTERY ADVENTURE: a Flat Corner in Clue 3, or a Dimensional Corner in Clue 4.


CLUE 3: Place a 2-1/2 inch Background Square over the corner where the Dark and Medium rectangles meet. Topstitch in the same direction as the triangle below: top left to bottom right of the square.



Trim both fabrics while leaving a quarter inch seam allowance for the Placemat and a Flat Cornered Quilt. Press. Repeat 4, 36 or 48 times.



CLUE 4: Fold a 2-1/2 inch Background Square in half by matching diagonally opposite corners with wrong sides together. Press. The unit should look like a triangle. Place the triangle over the corner of Block A unit. Secure with pins, OR machine baste along the edge to secure the triangle to 4, 36 or 48 units.
