#### **SPEAKING OF COLOR -**

### American Quilters Society Color Survey Results Rosemary Spatafora

When AQS asked quilters what color they use the most, **BLUE** topped the list. Of the 900 quilters who responded nearly 40% said they use blue fabric the most in their quilts. **GREEN** placed second and **RED** came in third as colors quilters use most.

Orange is the color that is least likely to appear in a quilters stash. When asked what color fabric was missing from their stash 25% of quilters said they have a scant collection of **ORANGE**, if any. Next color missing most was **BROWN** (20%) and then **PINK** (15%). Since Kona Cotton's Color of the Year for 2018 is Tiger Lily Orange, I wonder if we will be seeing more orange in quilts this year.

### CAMEO 2018 CHALLENGE QUILT

**Theme:** CAMEO Revelations - make a quilt featuring a cameo!

Cost: None to participants.

**Fabric:** Participant's choice. Use your own fabric, new or from stash. The guild will not be supplying any fabric.

**Timeline:** The challenge will be presented at the November, 2017 guild meeting. A sign up sheet will be available at the March and April, 2018 guild meetings. Quilts are to be brought early to the May guild meeting. Voting will be by the members present at the May, 2018 meeting.

Rules: the cameo (of any shape, not our Guild logo) may be pieced, appliquéd or a combination; embroidery and/or embellishments may be added. Quilt must have a cameo made from fabric or embroidery; attaching a cameo does not meet criteria. The finished quilt must be at least 12" x 12" and may not exceed 144" around the perimeter. It may be any shape. Quilts will be measured to determine eligibility for prizes. Finished quilt should be completed, quilted, bound and labeled. Use your original design; using someone else's pattern defeats the purpose of a challenge. Challenge committee members are not excluded from participation.

**Prizes:** To be determined - You are guaranteed the satisfaction of challanaina yourself!

### Research and Information

### The Quilts of Ken Burns submitted by Collette Pariseau

Yes, Ken Burns...the filmmaker. The one who creates award winning documentaries. His most recent was The Vietnam War. You may have seen it or The National Parks or The Roosevelts or many others he has created.

Ken Burns has been collecting quilts for about 40 years. His collection now includes about 75 quilts. Many are on display in his homes and office and many are in storage.

He is a storyteller. The stories he tells in his films are a response to a question he asks repeatedly: Who are we? He asks the same question when he looks at a quilt. He wants to know, or imagine, the national issues, the social struggles and successes in the lives of the people involved in the creation of the quilt. What does this quilt tell us about those who made it? Why this design? Why these colors? And the stitching...the designs, the detail, the quality. Who are we? Who are these people? What motivated them? The quilts are simply a different expression of the question that drives his work: Who are we?

Uncovered: The Ken Burns Collection opened at The International Quilt Study Center and Museum (www.quiltstudy.org) at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln in mid-January. It runs through May 13. This spring, Nebraska Educational Telecommunications (NET) will complete production of a show on the exhibit. The show will be available on their website.

Deadline for the February Silhouette is January 31.





### 2018 MyStery Quilt - Clue #2

- 1. **Make 66 half-square triangles.** Using #2 light fabric, draw a diagonal on 34, 3-7/8" squares. These were cut during Clue #1.
- 2. Layer each square with #7 medium 3-7/8" squares cut from Clue #1. Stitch 1/4" away from both sides of the diagonal line. Cut apart on drawn diagonal line. Press seams to darker fabric (Figure 1, below).
- 3. **Make 66 rectangle units.** Join the previously cut (Clue #1) 2" strips of #2 light and #3 light to make six (6) strip sets. Press seams toward darker fabric. Cut the strip sets into 3-1/2" units (Figure 2, below).
