

Membership News and Notes


Cindy May Membership Chairperson

What can a CAMEO member do,...?

You can..., stop at the Charity Table before the meeting starts or during Hospitality to sign in or sign out items for charity. The Charity Table will begin packing up when the meeting is adjourned so that the committee members can leave when the lights are turned off for the night. Please help by not waiting until the end of the meeting to get/turn in charity items.

You can..., look over the Fabulous Finds Table and pick up whatever appeals to you.

Take whatever you like. Also, you can donate items you no longer want that someone else might be able to use. Members are picking up fabric, books, notions, kits, all for free.

You can..., look over the Door Prize table, buy tickets and probably win a prize of your choosing. The Door Prize Committee has a great selection of quilting related items each month.

You can..., remember to bring in your layette donations for the church's Layette Program, one of CAMEO's sponsored charities for this year. All of the donated items from CAMEO will be given to the church following the April 21st guild meeting so that the church can begin making up the individual layettes. You can bring in items to the March and April meetings and sign them in to the Charity Table before the meeting or during Hospitality. Consider donating: diapers, wipes, onesies, bottles, Binkies, bibs, wash cloths, receiving blankets, or burp cloths, you know, the things a new baby needs; the church will distribute them to the new moms on Mother's Day.

You can..., save Saturday, March 19 for CAMEO's annual National Quilting Day celebration.

The day got its start with a guild in Kentucky in 1989 and grew to become an international event. National Quilting Day was sponsored by the National Quilt Association and proclaimed by Congress to be the third Thursday of March each year. (March is National Craft Month.) The day celebrates the art of quilting, not just quilts. One of the objectives is to devote as much time that day to quilting and the NQA requests that guilds across the USA engage in some kind of quilting activity during that Saturday in March. CAMEO's NQD Committee is planning a day of fun and camaraderie along with time for you to work on whatever project you choose. C.A.M.E.O. and celebrate quilting and being a quilter.

You can..., consider who in CAMEO should be nominated for the 2016-2017 Membership Vice President or for the 2016-2017 Scheduling Vice President officer positions.

The Membership VP serves as the chairman of the Membership Committee. That includes the meeting sign-in table, the member directory, and member applications. The membership VP may be assigned to be a liaison to guild committees as needed.

The Scheduling Vice President is responsible for finding and scheduling programs of interest to members and signing the contracts needed to secure the speakers/workshops related

to those programs. The Scheduling VP is elected in June of one year and has 15 months to make contacts and secure contracts before the scheduled programs begin. During the year in office, the Scheduling VP serves with the Facilitator VP as co-chair of the Program Committee and may be assigned to be a liaison to guild committees as needed.

The Nominations and Elections Committee is going to be coming to the members to get your selections for officers for next year. It is not too early to begin thinking about who should serve on the Executive Board next year; including yourself.

Oatmeal Craisins Dried Cranberries and Chocolate Chunk Cookies

This is the recipe for the cookies served at Charity Day 2016. Some of the members asked for the recipe. - Jodie Schlicht Recipe by: Ocean Spray at www.craisins.com Ingredients:

2/3 cup butter or margarine, softened 2/3 cup brown sugar

2 large eggs

1 ½ cups old-fashioned oats

1 ½ cups flour

1 tsp baking soda

½ tsp salt

1 - 5 ounce package Ocean Spray Craisins Original Dried Cranberries

2/3 cup white or semi-sweet chocolate chunks or chips, I used semi-sweet chocolate chips

Directions:

Preheat oven to 375 degrees F. Using an electric mixer, beat butter or margarine and sugar together in a medium mixing bowl until light and fluffy. Add eggs, mixing well. Combine oats, flour, baking soda and salt in a separate mixing bowl. Add to butter mixture in several additions, mixing well after each addition. Stir in dried cranberries and chocolate chunks. Drop by rounded teaspoonfuls or small cookie scoop onto ungreased cookie sheets. Bake for 10-12 minutes or until golden brown. Cool on wire rack. Makes approximately 2½ dozen cookies. Enjoy!

Research & Information

A Thread so Confusing by Shannon Boardman

No quilt can be completed without thread. But what thread to pick – cotton, silk, rayon, cotton-wrapped poly? Does it really matter all that much? As it turns out, yes. Each kind of thread has special characteristics and behaves differently. What follows is a brief summary of the strengths and weaknesses of each type of thread.

Rayon – Rayon thread is made by pressing a substance called cellulose acetate through small holes and solidifying it. The advantages of rayon are its high sheen, soft texture and heat resistance. It is also relatively inexpensive. Rayon's disadvantages are that it is often not colorfast and is not as strong nor as durable as the next thread type, polyester.

Polyester – Polyester thread is made from polymer resins. It comes in three types: spun (fibers are spun together and the thread looks like cotton), filament (a continuous fiber with a medium sheen) and trilobal (a high sheen continuous fiber which looks like rayon or silk). The advantages of polyester are its durability, strength and colorfastness. It retains its shape and can recover from stretch. One disadvantage of polyester thread is that it melts and is not recommended for projects where fire resistance is a concern.

Cotton – Cotton thread is the only 100% natural fiber thread made for high speed machines. It comes in various finishes such as mercerized (allows for better dye penetration, increased luster and increased strength), gassed (reduces fuzz and is also called silk finished or polished) and glazed or glace (treated with waxes or starches and is not recommended for machine use). The advantages of cotton are its softness and durability. Cotton thread easily adjusts to changes in the fabric, is available in various weights and is easy to care for. Its disadvantages are its low sheen and reduced strength compared to polyester. A low quality cotton thread can also be very linty.

Silk – Silk thread is often chosen for appliqué projects. Its advantages are its nice sheen and durability. Silk thread also has a shelf life that is much longer than the other types of thread and it will maintain its composition for many years. Disadvantages are its relatively high cost and low strength in comparison to the other types of thread.



CAMEO Quilters Guild General Membership Meeting February 18, 2016 - submitted by Rosemary Spatafora

Meeting took place at the Clawson United Methodist Church, 205 N. Main, Clawson, MI 48017

Called to order - 7:04 p.m. by Linda Watkins in Sharon Johnsonbaugh's absence. Linda led the Pledge of Allegiance, welcomed everyone and read CAMEO's mission statement.

Charity Show-n-Tell - Three charity quilts were shown. Sharon Cratsenburg reminded members about Charity Day on Saturday, Feb. 20 and Willie Pfeiffer showed samples of new patterns for Charity.

Minutes from January 21 General Meeting were amended and approved. (Laurie Johnson was added as a member of the Nominations & Elections committee.) Will be signed, dated & placed on file.

Whistle Stop - Two quilt shops (Fabric Affair and Sew Many Things) had tables and offered demos. Cindy May demonstrated a 3-D bow-tie block.

Field Trip Committee - Laurie Johnson reported that the committee is exploring a trip to the Michigan State University museum. Possible dates are April 9, May 14 and June 4. A sign-up sheet was passed around to determine member interest. MSU requires a minimum of 10 and a maximum of 20 for a program.

National Quilting Day - Tina Rink invited members to sign up at the Membership table for National Quilting Day on March 19. Tina also suggested that people to bring their mystery quilt as a project for National Quilting Day.

Retreat - Barb Lusk has sign-up forms and is taking payment for the retreat at the Membership table. Sharon Cratsenburg and Willie Pfeiffer showed examples of the mystery quilt.

Hospitality Break

V.P. Facilitator - Linda Watkins reported that we have enough registrations for the Joe Cunningham workshop in April so the lecture and workshop programs will take place. Workshop registration is still open with four spots remaining. Linda showed the Rock the Block workshop sample. Two yards of two fabrics (total of 4 yards) is required. Suzi Parron's barn quilt workshop in May requires a minimum of 15 people.

V.P. Membership - Cindy May - Currently 55 members; 33 are in attendance tonight with 5 guests. Cindy presented the idea of a photo addendum section for the 2016/2017 CAMEO directory. Members were asked to respond to a feedback survey about their interest in participating. Photos will only be included in each member's directory and will not be on the internet. The photo pages would add an additional \$78 to the cost of producing the directory. Plan is to start taking member photos in May or June.

Nominations and Elections - Joline Bowdich moved that the guild accept the following members as the Nominations and Election committee - Linda Pankratz, Sandy Peiss, Sybil Derderian and Laurie Johnson; seconded by Barb Veselenak. Motion passed.

Treasurer's Report - Sheryl Cawley reported amounts in our savings and checking accounts and the amount in our money market certificate. Our year to date expenses are \$5101.61 and our YTD deposits are \$4845.00. Report will be signed, dated and placed on file.

Bylaws & Revision Committee - Motion by Joline Bowdich to keep the references to associate membership as they are in the bylaws and standing rules until a revision committee reviews and evaluates them. Seconded by Carol Herzberg. Vote taken - 33 in support. Motion passed. A Bylaws Committee will be formed. Members wishing to be considered to serve on the committee should contact the members at large - Karla Sutton, Jodie Schlicht or Kay Schepke to sign up. Committee will be appointed at the February Executive Board meeting.

Quilt Show - Linda Watkins, Sharon Cratsenburg and Cindy May are co-chairing. Sharon described some of the changes for the June, 2017 show. Looking to make the show more educational and less profit driven. The raffle quilt and vendors will continue to be part of the show. The mini-quilt auction and basket raffle will be eliminated. The boutique room will become an Education room with demos, charity sewing, etc.

Royal Oak Library Exhibit - Members may give Rosemary their quilts tonight or on Saturday at Whistle Stop. Display will run through the month of March.

Minutes from January 28 Board meeting amended (added Laurie Johnson to Nominations & Elections committee) and approved. Signed, dated & placed on file.

Sharon Johnsonbaugh appointed members to the By-laws Revisions Committee as follows (from names submitted by February 24): Sandy Peiss, Janeen Sharpe, Sharon Cratsenburg, Cathy Mentkowski, Laurie Johnson, Barb Lusk and Cindy May.
