






Research and Information Sewing Machines Features

Congratulations if you received a new sewing machine as a

holiday gift! If not and you are still struggling with your current model, this information may be helpful when you shop for a new sewing machine.



Here are some guidelines from Consumer Reports:

Never pay full price. Look for online coupons from different manufacturers. Sales usually occur around Christmas and Mother's Day. If you are considering an independent dealer (many brands are sold only through independents), you may pay more than in a department store, but you should receive personalized customer service, in-house repairs and classes are sometimes offered. Sewing machines are typically kept for 10 years. You might be able to use your old machine as a trade-in. Remember to check the manufacturer's repair policies.

Test drive a machine before buying: Whether the sewing machine is mechanical or electronic, Consumer Reports states that you should look for these features:

Good ergonomics and control: Is the machine responsive to foot pedal pressure? Are the controls easy to reach and use? Lightweight: Is the machine easy to carry?

Automatic needle threader

Speed control for machine quilting

Adjustable pressure feet; also a 1/4" seam foot for machine piecing

Feed dog adjustment for machine quilting

Needle down position when stopping and pivoting while machine piecing

Thirty Minute Dinner Rolls

Mix and let sit for 15 min.:

1 Cup plus 2 Tbl. Warm water

1/3 C. oil

½ C. sugar

2 Tbl. Active dry yeast (same as two pkg, I used Rapid Rise)

Add:

1 egg

1 ½ tsp. salt

3 ½ C. flour

Grease 9 x 13 pan.

Form 12 balls with dough.

Rest 10 min.

Bake 400 degree for 10-15 min.

Optional: Brush with melted butter as removing from oven.

Call to Order: 7:03 P.M.

President Sharon Cratsenburg welcomed everyone and wished everyone Happy Holidays and a Happy New

Sharon read CAMEO's Mission Statement then led the members in the Pledge of Allegiance.

While everyone was standing, Sharon led the Blessing before dinner.

The potluck dinner began at 7:07 and the meeting resumed at 8:01P.M.

Theresa Nielsen, Chairman of Hospitality, announced the members of the Hospitality Committee and asked them to stand in recognition of the work they did for tonight's dinner/meeting.

Lynda Draudt, Membership Vice President - Wished a happy birthday to all the members who have December birthdays.

Sharon Cratsenburg presented a summary of the reasons for the Executive Board's recommendation to continue the 2 year cycle of hosting a quilt show by scheduling the next quilt show in Spring of 2015.
