### Apple Cake - Karla Sutton

3/4 C sugar
 large eggs
 C oil
 C peeled tart apples cut into chunks
 C flour
 tsp. baking soda
 tsp. salt
 tsp. vanilla
 tsp. cinnamon
 C Walnuts, chopped

March 6 is the deadline to get your quilt show entry long arm quilted by Barb, Ruth or Maggie and returned to you in time for the show. See their business ads in this newsletter.

Registration forms are in your newsletters to copy (or download and print), or you can get them at the February meeting. Silent Auction mini-quilts require a different form and it is in your newsletter.

March 21, the night of the March Guild Meeting is the last day to submit registration forms for your quilt entries. The quilt DOES NOT have to be finished before then, but the form is needed by 8 different committees to get their pre-show jobs done. Read both sides. Be sure to include either the exact width if known or an approximate width it will be when finished. It will be appreciated if you don't wait until the last date to submit your registrations.

You'll need a registration form for everything entered into the show. including special guild displays such as President's Quilts, Sit and Stitch group quilts, workshop quilts, and quilts made during CAMEO sponsored classes.

The actual entry quilts are due the morning of May 9 complete with hanging sleeve, label, and two photos.

At the February 21 Whistle Stop Guild Meeting Barb Lusk will be at a Stop to show the making and adding of a hanging sleeve.

Between 6 and 6:30 P.M. prior to each of the March and April Guild Meetings, Dorothy Strefling will be at the meeting location to demo making and adding a hanging sleeve. Also, she will have instruction sheets and pre-made muslin tubes.

Be sure to fill out a Silent Auction Registration Form (included in the newsletter) to accompany your donation. Remember, we need **your** estimated value of your quilt. The Silent Auction committee reserves the right to increase the estimated value of your quilt if you are too modest in your pricing. The value of the quilt is what you deem it to be worth - considering your time, effort, cost, creativity, etc. It is not necessarily the ultimate amount that the quilt will bring. Some quilts will bring more, some less than the estimated value. That's the fun of a Silent Auction! In the end it will all benefit CAMEO.
