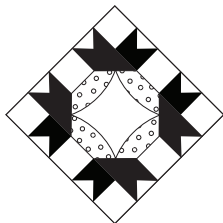

We have this weekend reserved at the Lions/Bear Lake Camp in Lapeer for a Fall Retreat! The minimum number of quilters needed is 25, so please invite your friends.

\$110 includes 2 meals each day: Friday (lunch & dinner), Saturday (brunch & dinner) and Sunday (breakfast & lunch). Those who check in early Thursday evening will need to bring their own dinner. A *very light* Friday breakfast will be supplied by the Guild.

The camp has not given us any guidelines yet, but other retreats are doing the following: Masks required when you enter the dining area; temperatures might need to be taken daily; staff will frequently clean the bathrooms; no communal snack table (keep your personal snacks with you). We hope to have one quilter per sewing table and one quilter per cubicle in the sleeping cabins for social distancing. Showers and toilets are dormitory style in each cabin and there are bathrooms in the sewing lodge.

Payment in full is needed (no deposits). Sharon Cratsenburg will collect all the checks and will NOT deposit them until October 15, when we are sure that the Retreat will be held. (This is to help with bookkeeping.) If the Retreat is cancelled, you can choose to have your check returned to you or shredded. More information will come as we know more, but we really need to have a Retreat, albeit a safe one!

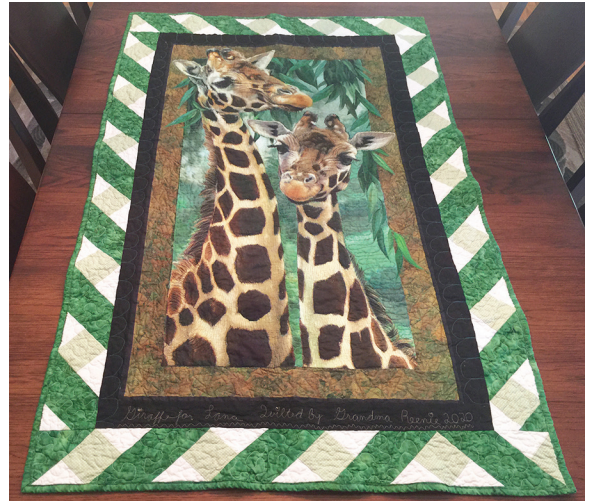

**Cameo Board Meeting
June 30, 2020 at 7pm
Minutes**

Board meeting was called to order at 7:15pm at the home of president Sharon Cratsenburg. Present were Ann Bonnelli, Jackie Considine, Kathy Debien, Laurie Johnson, Jan Recinos, Jean Schlegelmann. Absent were Darlene Baer, Pat Baldauf, Linda Griffin, Judy Murray

Minutes. from May 19 were approved and placed on file.

Corresponding Secretary Kathy Debien had sent out a number of June birthday cards. Sympathy cards were sent to Vera Milz family and to Barbara Gerard.

Hearts and Hugs were discussed. What do people do with them? Could they be made into a useful article, a hot pad or a mug mat etc. We could have a work meeting to make up the hearts we have or volunteers could be asked to take a couple to make up. Shelved for further discussion.

VP Membership Laurie Johnson. 26 people have renewed so far. Laurie will send out an email reminder and list those who have renewed. All renewals should be sent to Laurie's home address, check and renewal form.

VP Facilitator Jan Recinos. Zoom meeting of June 25th was discussed. Jan is concerned with reaching people who did not participate Will people watch recordings? How many explored any of the Video tutorials that were in the June Silhouette where all you had to do was press on the highlighted web address? Time limits and costs on Zoom, Facebook were compared. She is working with Henya on a block exchange.

President Sharon Cratsenburg. As a way of keeping members in touch an outside, acceptable social distance picnic was proposed. Jackie Considine will explore the availability and cost of reserving space at Starr Jaycee Park at 13 Mile and Crooks in Royal Oak for Thursday, July 23 from 4pm. Bring your own food, beverage, utensils etc and SHOW & TELL. This is not a meeting and not a pot luck. Just come and meet each other and exchange news of how you are and what you have been doing.

Linda Wallace's Charity report showed donations totaling \$7,209.

Will need an August Board Meeting. All Committees will be new in September as usual, only the Board will stay on. Discussion of amending the Hospitality Committee to be more of an Outreach Committee that would be in frequent communication with members but that was attributed to the role of Members at Large. Further discussion needed. Audit Committee will begin work as soon after July 15 as possible

Treasurer Jackie Considine presented the Treasurer's Report. She has not received all the Raffle Ticket money yet. This year's books must be closed before Audit Committee can begin. All money given to Treasurer must be accompanied by appropriate paper work.

Terminology in the software used is confusing and changes were suggested. The Treasurer's job is complicated and it takes the first year in office to learn all the things that will come up and then they can just serve one more year. The Board proposed that it should be taken to the Membership that the bylaws be changed. Kathy Debien made the motion that, "An Active Member may serve as Treasurer for a maximum of four years." Seconded by Jean Schlegelmann. Motion passed.

VP Scheduling Jean Schlegelmann. Still waiting to hear back from Valina James, the Laura Heine speaker, whether she is available any other month than April. Jean shared her ideas for programs for each month centering around Circle of Friends and BETH: Block, Example, Technique and History. Nothing can be formalized until we know if and when we can be meeting in person or if we have to do them virtually. Jean will continue as VP Scheduler so should also start to think about 2021/2022.
