

So (sew) to celebrate, we are creating a challenge to our members. Besides being a prime number, what does 25 mean to you? Put that connection into a guilted item.



HELP WANTED: NO MONEY FUN

You have heard the Treasurer's Report at each guild meeting this year and have noticed that our funds are dwindling. Part of the reason is that we waited three years to mount a quilt show (our major fundraiser). We have had to stretch our expenses over a 3-year span instead of the usual 2-year time frame.

Our fixed expenses are rent, insurance, costs associated with having speakers/workshops, and the quilt show. We need funds to get the show off the ground. I'm not short, I'm concentrated. The vendors' table fees subsidize the rent for the building space for the quilt show; hopefully that money will be repaid when we earn enough from entry fees, raffle ticket sales, the basket raffle and the silent auction. Anything that is left is profit.

Having said all that, the Executive Board and VP Scheduler Jean Schlegelmann have been mulling over some ideas for future guild meetings.

Instead of paying for a speaker (and her travel expenses with room and board), there are other ways to entertain ourselves. Our membership is very talented and experienced; we can draw upon that for activities during some of the Decemberly meetings.

Below are some ideas for you to think about. Please contact Jean S if you have any other ideas to share or are willing to participate. Your participation is what will make this work; many other guilds draw upon members for Lectures and Truck Shows - CAMEO will be what **you** make it!

- Sit 'n Stitch Group Trunk Show (or a Sew-Along Group or an individual member)
- Quilter's Games Bunko, Poker, ect.
- Demonstrations of domestic machine quilting; set-in seams, Y-seam construction, ect.
- Block Research & Demonstrations A team of guild members will research an assigned traditional quilt block, demonstrate its assembly and show quilts made with that particular block. It would be interesting to see how that block has changed over the years into a modern interpretation. This would take some planning but could be very rewarding!

All members are encouraged to enter at least one new quilt. Also, in celebration of our twenty-fifth anniversary members are asked to show a quilt that has been at an earlier quilt show. We will have a silent auction of miniature/small quilts and Linda distributed the guidelines and sizes. There will be baskets, details later. Please donate and/or make items for door prizes, Cheryl Cawley showed a pin cushion suggestion. In December there will be a sign-up sheet for volunteers, everyone is asked to participate. President Sharon Cratsenburg October Board Meeting Minutes were approved.

Holiday potluck was discussed, particularly whether, in the spirit of our name, we should invite as guests, the half a dozen visiyors who have attended meetings this year. However, it was felt that such a change should not be made without membership input, particularly as it had evoked controversy some years ago.

Quilt Show

Linda Watkins will not be co-chairing, so direct any questions to Sharon.

Cheryl Cawley is responsible for door prizes. Please consider donating small hand made items. Cheryl will have an article in Newsletter.

Contract with Madison Place is reserved but not signed yet.

Racks for hanging quilts have been ordered.

Sharon is working on acquiring vendors.

If you have ideas about quilt display groupings let Sharon know.

Raffle Quilts continue to be displayed. Jan Recinos will contact some Libraries to see if they can be displayed there. So far 640 tickets have been sold, our goal is 5000.

Cameo Logo Register Mark Sharon has contacted Neil Strefling for advice. He will get back to her.

Retreats. Bear Lake Fall Retreat is only available October 30- November 1. Must have a minimum of 30 participants. Laurie Johnson and Cheryl Cawley will investigate interest.

Colombiere Retreat. Please explore the possibility of having a whole table for each person to work on.

Sharon received a thank you for our \$100 donation from Miracle Quilts.

VP Facilitator Jan Recinos. Mary Delray's Sashiko Workshop went very well. There were 9 attendees, one a guest who found out about the workshop from the Royal Oak Review. Mary donated a book for our Quilt Show prizes. The Drury Inn worked out very well for her two-night stay. There are only three registrations for the Quiltworx Scandavian Snowflakes. Jan must cancel if there are not more interested, by December 19th. Jan will send one more e-mail to membership asking anyone else interested to e-mail her before December 1st so that she can order the patterns. Plans for February's Whistle Stop are proceeding. Jan has checked on whether the Church will permit us to place a sign in front of the Church, announcing our meeting, a day or two before. Lauries will get an estimate of cost, probably white on green.

VP Programs Jean Schlegelmann. Reported that lecturers are more difficult to secure than workshop presenters. As money is tight this year, should we consider programs featuring our own members as presenters.

Treasurer Pat Baldauf for Jackie Considine presented our current financial balance.

Money is very tight this year, partly because we have the Quilt Show and also because we have not had one for three years, should we consider reducing the amount spent on either Charity Day or Quilt Day and have people bring their own lunches? The proposal was made to put our meetings' rental money in a separate account so, it would not be accidentally spent. This will be checked out with Jackie.

Meeting adjourned 9:00pm.



Laundry Basket Quilts

Friendship Spool Pincushion



Finished Size 5" x 4"

Cutting Spool Body A - 1 rectangle 2" x 3" using multi color strips of fabric

B - 2 rectangles 1" x 3" using dark fabric

C - 4 squares 1" x 1" using light fabric

D - 2 rectangles 1" x 3" using light fabric

E - 4 rectangles 1" x 4" using light or medium fabric

F - 2 rectangles ³/₄" x 5" using dark fabric


G - 2 rectangles ³/₄" x 4 ¹/₂" using dark

Backing - 2 rectangles 4 ½" x 5 ½"

Batting - 1 rectangle 4 ½" x 5 ½"




Sew




Note: Sew a panel of strips and then cut a 2" x 3" rectangle for the Spool Body A.

Place square C right side down on each corner of B. Draw a line thru the center of square from point to point as shown to the left and sew over that line to create a triangle. Trim ¼" outside of seam, flip open, and then press.







Pin Cushion Assembly

- Starting with rectangle A sew light piece D to left and right sides
- Add previously prepared C+D to the top and bottom of A+B ٠
- Sew E to the sides and then to the top and bottom of assembly
- Finish top by sewing rectangle F to right and left sides then rectangle G to top and bottom •
- Layer with thin batting and internal backing.
- Quilt in the ditch outlining spool
- Sew external backing onto quilted top right sides together; remember to leave a small opening to turn pincushion right side out and stuff.
- Turn right side out, fill with sand or rice, and close opening by hand with a whip stitch.
