
HOLIDAY POT LUCK December 21

And a Big Thank you to Betty Busker who cut most of the kits.



Crazy Quilting Material List - January 2024 Theresa Nielsen

Where you can play with fabrics and lace, be creative and break all the rules? That's right, there are no rules in crazy quilting. I will share some samples of my crazy quilts at the December meeting.

For the January meeting, I will share some tips and tricks that I use and walk you through the process to make your own crazy quilt.

Some supplies needed for making crazy quilts at the Saturday workshop:

Types of fabrics that work well are silk, satin, wool, cottons, lightweight tapestry pieces, men's ties, old linens, etc.

Lace, ribbons, different kinds of yarn, beads, sequins, embroidery floss, buttons, charms.

Also, I use a piece of muslin or plain cotton for my backing to lay the fabrics down.

As it turns out, quilting has many positive health benefits for us beyond the fact that our quilt-making results in beautiful and functional quilts.

In her article "Did You Know Quilting Has Positive Health Benefits?" Beth Cooper from nancysnotions.com lists a number of positive health benefits of quilting including:

Stress Relief and Relaxation -The rhythmic and repetitive nature of quilting can induce a meditative state that calms the mind and reduces anxiety.

Cognitive Stimulation and Memory Enhancement - Quilting is a mental exercise that helps to keep the mind sharp, no matter what your age.

Boosting Creativity and Self-Expression - Quilting is a deeply fulfilling, creative form of self-expression.

Social Connections and Community Building - Quilting's rich history of bringing people together to share ideas, knowledge and support provides a sense of belonging that can promote mental well-being.

Fine Motor Skills and Hand-Eye Coordination - The repetitive nature of stitching, cutting fabric, and manipulating small pieces enhances hand-eye coordination, making quilting an excellent activity for individuals of all ages.

Sense of Achievement and Legacy - Quilts can become cherished family heirlooms, passed down through generations. Knowing that one's work will endure beyond their lifetime can provide a sense of purpose and fulfillment. Whether you are a seasoned quilter or a novice just embarking on this quilting adventure, remember that quilting is more than just a craft; it is a therapeutic journey that nurtures our entire being. 






November: Log Cabin Block (Underground Railroad)
