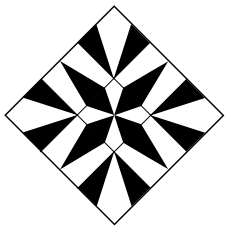
CLOCKWISE PILLOW WORKSHOP:

This pillow cover finishes at 20" x 20". **Skillbuilders: Making a pillow envelope back and learning how to spiral quilt with a walking foot and guide.**

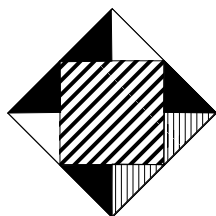

Retreat: There are 33 people registered so we have met our minimum. There is no maximum number that may attend. It is open to non-members. Deposits must be in by January 31.

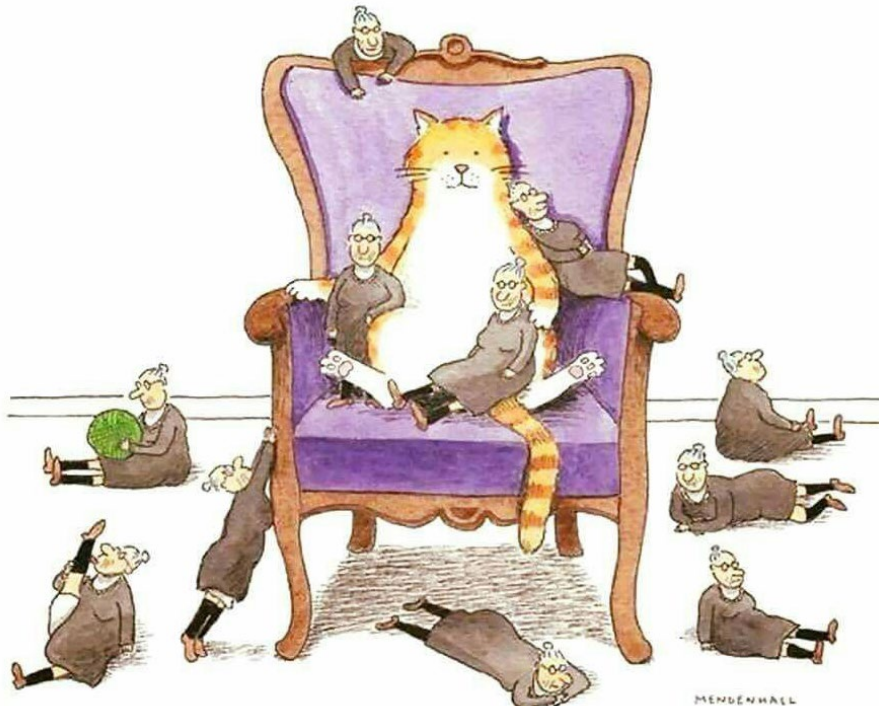
Tina Rink displayed the Mystery Quilt. It was a pillow with the word JOY on it.
