

# A Message from the President Carole Gilbert

Happy New Year!

We will continue to hold our dual meetings for the foreseeable future, with those who can attend face-to-face meeting with us at Clawson United Methodist Church and those of you who cannot, via Zoom. That said, in Michigan we always have to think about the weather, so if schools are closed, we will hold a particular meeting via Zoom. A link will be sent out just as soon as we know that the meeting at the church is not feasible.

In January, we will vote on CAMEO's revised Bylaws and Standing Rules. These are provided for your perusal in the emailed issue of the Silhouette in accordance with the present Bylaws. You will note that these revisions drastically cut the present ones by several pages. This is in line with Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised 11th Edition. Note that Bylaws define the primary characteristics of an organization and how it functions. They are not supposed to contain everything that an organization DOES.

Standing Rules are matters of established custom and relate to the administration of an organization. They are also easier to change so that new things that come up (or things that no longer work for the Guild) can be easily added or subtracted.

The Bylaws Committee thought that putting the duties of officers and committee chairs on a thumb drive so that they could be printed out and given to each newly elected officer or to committee chairs would make them more accessible. This prevents manuals from being lost (as they appear to be every year) and also makes it easier to update as appropriate.

I am looking for a couple of folks to help me put together a BETH Project for our March meeting. As a reminder: BETH stands for Block, Examples, Techniques, and History. I am thinking of featuring the New York Beauty block. Please let me know which topic you would like to take on. I will be twisting some arms if you don't volunteer!
