

Supplies for the FREE Crazy Quilting Workshop:

- 1 Scissors for cutting fabric, also small scissors for fussy cutting, etc
- 2 Thread, Needles (embroidery and crewel) large eye needles also helpful
- 3 **Square of muslin or thin batting for the foundation**; 18" x 18" is a good starting size.
- 4 Variety of Scrap Fabrics, any type



Hope everyone had a wonderful holiday. I just heard that one of our new members spent her New Year finishing a Charity quilt top - and not just a quilt top but her Charity Challenge quilt! This made Jean Schlegelmann very happy. Hope others are working on their Charity Challenge quilts. We will be accepting them in the month of May.

On November 11th, we worked together making quilt tops for Mid-Michigan Honor Flight. I had about 30 kits that were taken. I know that Maggie took home 8 completed top to be quilted. I am asking that if you took a kit home, please bring the completed top back at the next meeting (Janaury). If you can quilt and bind it that would be great but let me know. I need to have an idea of where we stand. My goal is to be able to give them the quilts in April when they resume flying the vets to Washington DC.

Mark your calendars for Charity Day which is Saturday Feb. 17. We start at 9:00 and go to 3:00. Thank you goes out to Carol Herzberg and Lynda Draudt for cutting pillowcases and to Jean Schlegelmann for cutting burp cloths. Before I agree to a new year, I need to see some terms & conditions.

On Charity Day, the Charity Committee provides the kits to be worked on. Needless to say we will be working on pillowcases, burp clothes, bibs, and regular quilt top kits.

Underground Railroad Update

Two new blocks will be introduced at the January meeting. Written cutting instructions will be passed out at that time.

Four additional blocks will be demonstrated during February's Whistle Stop.

Here is where we are through the end of 2023 (no blocks were introduced in December):

Jacob's Ladder Basket
Monkey Wrench Log Cabin
Bear's Paw Shoo Fly

This is an optional activity - you can participate or not. You can make all the blocks or repeat just one block multiple times and make your quilt any size or color.

CAMEO's 30th Year Challenge!

Something to keep in mind...

CAMEO held its first meeting in September 1993, so technically we are well into our 30th year!

For our next quilt show, it would be nice to have a display of quilts that depict "Thirty." It could be 30 blocks or 30 fabrics or a representation of the number 30 (just some suggestions). You may have your own idea?

Let's keep it a MINIMUM of 30 inches by 30 inches (just to reinforce the theme). One traditional color for a 30 year anniversary is green, which is also CAMEO's logo color! Try to use green as your main color, if at all possible. We'll decide on a due date (which should be next guild year) and talk more about this at our meeting.

A Short History of Crazy Quilting

The rule of crazy quilting is "there are no rules." Crazy quilting roughly covered a period of 1850 -1900 culminating at the world fair of 1876 I Philadelphia. There participants were influenced by Japanese threads and motifs. History is sketchy on the origins but thought to be a response to the mechanization of the industrial movement.

"More is more" was the theme. Many utilized lavish decorations of beads, buttons and lace embroidered on a random assembly of various fabrics, brocades, wools, silks and cottons. Some considered their quilts as a personal scrapbook.

Crazy quilts were labor intensive and fell out of fashion. The most valued are prized for their opulent embellishments.
