#### Sourdough Method for "Leaders & Enders"

It's a specific type of leader-ender project\* whereby you cut pieces from your scraps for a particular quilt rather than cutting random scraps and saving those for a future, unknown project. This way, your scraps are used!

The Sourdough quilting method is about making scrap quilts. Lots of scrap quilts, without having lots of scraps laying around and not knowing what to do with them.

**Overview of the Sourdough method:** make the initial starter by cutting scraps to the sizes needed, use part of the starter by sewing them up, add more starter ingredients (scraps cut to the sizes needed), and just keep repeating. You'll have a Sourdough Quilt in no time!

#### First thing you need to do is pick a scrap pattern that you like.

Determine what size patches/pieces/strips of fabric scraps you need to make that particular quilt.

#### Pick a second scrappy quilt pattern that you just love.

Determine what size patches/pieces/strips of fabric scraps you need to make that second quilt.

#### Create a box for each of the scrappy quilt patterns you selected.

As you cut up scraps, cut them to the sizes you need for these two quilt patterns you selected.

Now, you fill the boxes with scraps that you are cutting to the sizes you need. You're not cutting up random sizes and throwing them in piles in drawers. You are actually cutting up fabric to meet the sizes needed to make those two quilts.

So every few weeks you can sit down and sew up the blocks that are in each box, all ready cut and ready to sew. Now cut more scraps to fit those quilts and put in the boxes until you have enough in the box again to spend a few hours just sewing.

And just keep repeating until you've got enough scraps in the box to finish that particular quilt.

Now pick another pattern, or two, or three, and repeat!

\* Leader-Ender are bits of fabric used to start and end your sewing, similiar to chain piecing. When you get to the end of your chain piecing, you stitch onto a fabric scrap so that you always have a scrap under you presser foot ready for the next chain piecing session. Leader-enders prevent a thread nest from forming on the underside of your stitching. If you piece scraps of fabric for leaders and enders, you will be piecing together a scrap quilt at the same time as you piece another project. They are an efficient use of your sewing time.


# MyStery Quilt From May, 2019

## Making the Triangle in a Square

1. Fold the 5" Background fabric strip in half right sides together. This step is essential for mirror image pieces. Layer cut (128) 2½" x 5" rectangles.



2. Layer cut pieces on one diagonal. Sort the triangles so they are right sides up.



3. Using the Triangle Ruler, cut (64) triangles from the 4" Medium fabric strips and (64) triangles from the 4" Dark fabric strips.



Accurately lining up the top of the Triangle Ruler with the strip is most critical.



4. Lay out the large Triangle with the base at the bottom. Position the Background triangles on both sides of the large Triangle. Make sure all fabrics are turned right side up.




- 5. Set the right stack aside.
- 6. Flip the large Triangle right sides together over the Background triangle. The left fabric extends beyond the large Triangle to create a tip at the flat top of the Triangle.







- Sew. Set seams with Background triangle on top, open, and press toward Background triangle
- 8. Place the remaining triangle to the right of the Dark Triangle. Flip right sides together, lining the top tip of both pieces together.
- 9. Sew and press towards the right triangle.



10. Place patch on a small cutting mat. Place Triangle in a Square ruler on top of patch. Line up red lines with seams. Seams are ¼" from top edge, and ½" from corners. Trim patch on all four sides to 3½" square.






## For the Scrappy Quilt:


Layout your Star Centers and Star Points on a large flannelboard to decide placement of fabrics.

## Making Twelve Blocks


1. Lay out twelve patches in each stack.

Flip right sides together to complete the rows. Press seams away from the Triangle in a Square patches.






3. Sew the Rows together. Press seams away from middle Row.



## Making the Lattice

- Make 15.
   Press seams toward middle square.
- Make 16.Press seams toward middle square.




## For the Scrappy Quilt:

There are two different fabrics in each lattice.

## Completing the Quilt

1. Lay out the 12 Blocks.
31 Lattice, (4) 3½"
Background squares, 20
Cornerstones and (14) 3½"
x 9½" Background pieces.
Sew to complete each Row and then sew the Rows together.
