AQS Quilt Week 2020 Grand Rapids Bus Trip arranged by Royal Oak Senior Center


Wednesday, Aug. 19, 2020 7:30am-7:00pm

2020 QUILT SHOW SILENT AUCTION OF MINI QUILTS

Miniature/Small quilts should be no smaller than 12" x 12" and no larger than 36" x 36", any shape.

Attribution must be given to the designer unless you use a traditional quilt pattern or your original design. If using a copyrighted pattern, email the designer for permission to donate the completed quilt (not the pattern itself) stating that CAM-EO is a 501c(7) non-profit. May your troubles be as few as your grandmother's teeth. If you are concerned about copyright, it's easier to use a traditional block or your own design.

Quilts are to be turned in to Theresa Nielsen or Shannon Boardman by May 1, 2020 to be auctioned during the 2020 Quilt Show. Please ask them for a form.





CAMEO Quilters Guild 2020-21 Executive Board Nominations Form

PRESIDENT: Presides over the meetings and oversees the organization of the guild:

FACILITATOR VP: Promotes and implements the programs and workshops for the 2020-21 guild year.

SCHEDULING VP: takes 12-15 months to schedule programs (speakers and workshops) for the 2021-22 guild year.

MEMBERSHIP VP: Maintains and keeps membership records current, produces the directory, receives and processes membership applications and fees, chairs Membership Committee, which helps at the membership table during general meetings.

RECORDING SECRETARY - Takes minutes at guild and board meetings and maintains a file of those records:

CORRESPONDING SECRETARY: Maintains a file of all correspondence: shares pertinent correspondence with members, handles correspondence as directed by the Board.

TREASURER: is the custodian of the guild's funds and financial records: prepares annual budget, pays expenses, does the banking and is required to give a financial report at each meeting.

ASSISTANT TREASURER: aids the Treasurer, helps prepare annual budget, reconciles the bank statement and uses guild money to meet the regular monetary obligations of the guild such as insurance and required fees.

MEMBERS AT LARGE : There are 3 who serve to represent the General Membership and convey member interests and concerns to the Executive Board.

Meeting called to order by President Sharon Cratsenburg at 7:00pm. After the Pledge of Allegiance, President Sharon Cratsenburg welcomed everyone.

ANNOUNCEMENTS:

Carol Herzberg announced a trip planned to Grand Rapids for the AQS quilt show on Wednesday August 19th, by bus through the Royal Oak Senior Center. Bus would leave promptly at 7:30 am and return by 7:00 pm. The cost would be \$43 and includes the price of admission for the show. Please go to the Royal Oak Senior Center on Marais in Royal Oak to pay and register for the trip. Article to be in newsletter.

Minutes from the January 2020 meeting were accepted and placed on file

President Sharon Cratsenburg stated we are doing our business meeting first tonight and then we will have Whistle Stop. There are 3 stations for Whistle Stop: Linda Watkins - demo on quilt sleeve, Pat Baldauf - Flying geese ruler, and Henya Rachmiel - quilt labels.

Nominations & Elections Jan Recinos, Pat Cason-Merenda, and Jackie Considine volunteered to be on committee. Kathy Wilson moved to accept the committee, Barb Lusk seconded, motion was passed.

Quilt Show There are several venues scheduled for sales of Raffle tickets for quilts. We need members to go to other venues to sell the tickets.

We need to sell as many Raffle tickets as possible. Please see Linda Watkins to get more tickets. This is where a large portion of our profits come.

Sign up by May 1st to submit a mini quilt for **Silent Auction**. Shannon Boardman and Theresa Nielson are chairs of Silent Auction with Lynda Wolfe assisting.

Basket Auction - Bring in your Baskets at the May Guild meeting, wrapped in cellophane if possible. The guild has cellophane wrap. See Laurie Johnson.

Several vendors have signed up for the show.

Food vendor is an issue. Previous food vendor is unavailable. Please email Sharon with any suggestions.

There will be a table set up at each meeting for quilt show information. Linda Watkins for raffle tickets, Cheryl Cawley will accept any door prizes. All info for show will be at these tables.

Spring Retreat Make and Take projects - attendees will get pattern when retreat is paid in full.

Membership Laurie Johnson announced that we had 32 members at the meeting including 1 new member, Marie Weisserman along with a guest of Linda Watkins'. Current membership total is 50.

Fall Retreat at Bear Lake is scheduled for 10/30 thru 11/1. 13 people have signed up, need minimum of 25. Friday lunch and dinner will be served, Sat – brunch and dinner service, Sunday – breakfast and lunch.

Scheduling for 2020-21: (1) Jean Schlegelman found a Laura Heine instructor for April. She will be offering a quilt of a Vintage Sewing Machine. (2) Asking for a three-woman team to do research on quilt history, techniques and samples (like Wedding Ring) to be presented at a guild meeting next year. This could fulfill the Research & Information committee requirement. Contact Jean Schlegelmann. (3) Long-time CAMEO members (10-15 years) will be asked to bring in their quilts for a future trunk show.

Hospitality and Show and Tell followed the business meeting. The meeting ended 9:10 p.m.

Nominations: Jan Recinos has the green folder for Nominations and Elections.

She surveyed the Board members who were present and Jan will run again as VP Facilitator, Jackie Considine is willing to run for Treasurer again and Laurie Johnson is eligible to run again for VP Membership.
