

CAMEO Guild Minutes: Thursday April 20, 2023

Meeting was called to order by our president, Carole Gilbert at 7:00 pm; she led us in the Pledge of Allegiance.

<u>Charity committee report; Linda Wallace:</u> By our May meeting (5-18-23), remember to turn in your charity quilt challenge from the bag of 2 ½" strips that were handed out on charity quilt day, Feb 18th. You will need to use some of your own fabric. Minimum size is 36" X 36". Prizes will be awarded for one finished quilt and one quilt top. Charity committee is grateful for everyone who participated. If you have not finished, keep on sewing!

Program: Loreen Garrison introduced our speaker Tori McElwain of thequiltpatchbytori.com. She is new to Michigan with 20 years' experience in quilting; a former kindergarten teacher. Tori is a quilt pattern designer as well. She has patterns available at Etsy and her own website. For designing, she uses both pen and paper (preferably dot graphs) as well as E-Quilter. You can sign up for her newsletter for more information. Tonight's program: Movement in Quilting. She used her quilts to illustrate the 4 elements of Movement: piecing, color, patterns, and quilting. After the program, Tori had her patterns and merchandise available for purchase.

<u>Recording Secretary Report: Louise</u> – No changes or corrections to the minutes as published in our April newsletter; they will be signed and placed on file.

<u>Treasurer Report: Janeen</u> – Balances were reported, RE: spending we are over budget by ~\$2,200, which is normal for a non-Quilt Show year. We have managed to cut back on expenses which is good.

<u>President's Report: Carole</u> – Our board member, VP Facilitator, Pat Baldauf, passed away after a long illness, we learned on Sunday the 16th. Funeral will be held on Sunday, April 23 at Desmond Funeral Home in Troy. Flowers from the Guild will be sent, and donations can be made to the Rose Cancer Center or the Juvenile Diabetes Foundation. This leaves the position of VP Facilitator vacant, and as we are near the end of the guild's year, we will not be filling the position.

Our program for May is to reprise the Whistle Stop program which was cut short in February due to the weather. Our June meeting will be our Potluck and Elections. All officers and past officers are requested to turn in their officer manuals to Carole. The membership registration form will be available. These running for office must pay their dues by the June meeting. <u>Vice President-Membership: Bonny</u> – Due to Pat's passing we have lost one in membership; Tonight, we have 25 members and 6 guests present.

<u>Vice President-Scheduling: Loreen</u> – Our May workshop on Featherweight Maintenance registration is due this Saturday April 22nd. The fee is \$25.00 <u>Corresponding Secretary: Rosemary</u> – absent, no report

<u>Round Robin: Barb Lusk</u> – 3 were participating, Judy M., Barb L, and Pat B. Barb and Judy will finish the quilt Pat was working on.

Old Business: President's Report/Bylaws Committee: Carole -

The bylaws are recommended by the board, the board passed, not unanimously. The objections centered around the board job descriptions not being listed in the bylaws. As per the revised Roberts Rules, all that needs be listed is a summary. The complete Job Descriptions will be kept as a separate document with 4 master copies maintained. The Bylaws were adopted with a vote of 15 for and 6 against. Standing Rules: discussion of Rule #9. It was proposed to change to "Gifts presented to CAMEO will be distributed to all members at the discretion of the executive board."

<u>Recording Secretary's Report; Louise:</u> The March 23, 2023 minutes were approved as printed in the April Silhouette newsletter and will be signed and placed on file.

<u>President's Report/Comments; Carole:</u> A big thanks to our Bylaws committee Carol and Lynda Draudt for their extended and exacting work on revising, formatting and typing up the bylaws. Thanks to those board members who have emailed their Job Descriptions and please email to Carole from the rest of the board.

Membership Report; Bonny: Will be revising and updating the membership form for the May meeting and for publishing on the website. Some changes include the line indicating how to be notified in case of a meeting cancellation. Options would be text, email or phone call. Membership checks can be mailed directly to Bonny for the coming year, or can be given to her at the May meeting. Reminder that those running for election to the board must have their dues paid by the date of the June Potluck/Election meeting. On the form, members will be able to indicate which committee they choose to serve on. There will be 4 standing committees from which to choose. Membership booklets will be emailed for the coming year and members can print out on their own and re-use their sturdy folders from this year. There were 4 membership folders that never got picked up in September. Discussion of how to increase membership beyond reaching out to former members. Proposal to provide a series of workshops or guilt-in days for Girl scouts to bring in a younger generation of people to generate interest in quilting.
