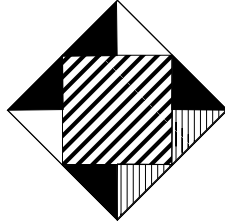

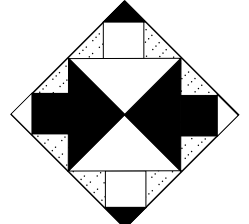

November is the month Charity collects donations for HAVEN. For those who do not know, HAVEN is a shelter for women and children suffering from abuse located in Pontiac. Donating is optional. Each year CAMEO asks its members to make a Christmas tote bag and fill it with new, small personal items such as: shampoo, conditioner, body wash, toothpaste, toothbrushes, hairbrush, combs, scarfs, gloves, hats, socks, etc. which are age-appropriate. Also diapers, wipes and baby bottles are needed.

For a mother you could also include word search, crossword puzzles, books, nail care, etc.

For children: puzzles, coloring books, crayons, color pencils, toy jewelry, dolls for little girls, match box cars, trucks for little boys

The directions to make a tote bag are on page 6. Then you fill the bag with the above items. Make sure you pin a size label ID to the bag with woman, or small girl/small boy, infant or teen girl/teen boy. Try to use gender-neutral colors. (Remember that teen boys may wear men's sized clothing.)

NO toys with weapons (including squirt guns), no candles, no DVDs or gifts with violent themes. No edible items or used items.

All items are to be brought to our next meeting which is Thursday November 17th. Look for MAGGIE SMITH at the Charity table. (Linda Wallace will be out of town).

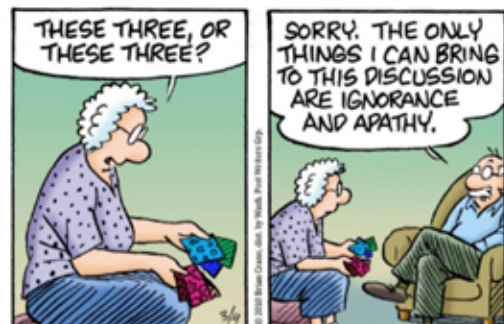
Please be sure you sign them in and we will need to know the value of the items you bring.

Charity Committee report: Linda Wallace: Bags for Haven will be due at November meeting- filled with toiletries, etc. Please pin a tag indicating for woman/infant/sm. Boy/sm. Girl. Pick up instructions to sew a bag & kits at the charity table. If you wish to donate a Gift, also available are list of items the Haven is requesting. Also, gift cards for Meijer, Target, etc. are great. All due Nov. 17.

Our speaker Sara Gallegos of Love of Quilting TV show and Co-owner of Decorative Stitch in Shelby Twp, was introduced by Pat Baldauf. You can watch Love of Quilting Saturday mornings on PBS. Sara did not have staff to bring her store to us, but extended a 20% discount to attendees at the store in the week following. Thank you, Sara! Thanks to Sara for the Trunk show of her beautiful quilts!

Recording secretary's report: Louise McCormick-Glazier: The minutes from our September meeting, as printed in Oct Newsletter were accepted with one correction: The Storage closet was cleaned out by Carole G. Barb L and Jackie C. Corrected, and will be placed on file.

Reports: The Bylaws Committee met, composed of Kathy D. Lynda D. Carol H. Jackie C. and Barb L.

Treasurer's Report: Janeen Sharpe presented a written report of our account balances, which will be added to the files. The budget for 2022-23 was presented, Lynda Draudt moved to accept, Rosemary seconded; and approved by the membership. More members are needed.

Membership: Bonny Heinzl: 23 members attended the meeting as well as 11 Guests. Welcome!

VP Facilitator Report: Pat Baldauf (standing in for President): Committees need more members.

We have one member for hospitality, and one for Door Prizes. Everyone is asked to help with clean-up after the meeting.

Retreat: Sharon Cratsenburg: 23 people are going to Lions, Bear Lake. Arrive at 2:30 pm. First meal served is Friday; Friday arrivals after 10 am. Need 2 volunteers to take supplies: retreat box, extension cords, cutting boards and rulers.

Quilting with Confidence Class: Darlene & Judy: Free to members, November meets on Tuesday, 11-15-22; topic: half-square triangles. December: Thursday 12-8-22; topic flying geese.

Fabulous Finds: Rosemary S.: some special fabric, she won't be taking it home. (Save it from the trash!)

Round Robin: Barb L.: Create a block 10 or 12", and include some fabric if you want. Subsequent participants will add borders to the block and circulate monthly until April.

V.P. Scheduling: Loreen Garrison: Pat Rapanos of Park Bench Quilt Shop will come for a trunk show on Thursday, November 17, and workshop the Sparrow Quilt, Saturday, November 19, focusing on being organized with your cutting. Only 3 members have signed up thus far. It will be canceled if we do not have sufficient participation.

Other: We have members attending online tonight, and hybrid meetings will continue.

Newsletter: Laurie Johnson: Deadline is November 6th. Slip of the Keyboard is back! To encourage you to read all your newsletter. Tonight's winner Cheryl C.

The next board meeting is Thursday, October 27 at Janeen Sharpe's house.

CAMEO Quilters Guild Board Meeting - October 27, 2022

Meeting called to order at 7:02 p.m. by Pat Baldauf. Meeting was held on Zoom.

Present: Janeen Sharpe, Jackie Speer, Carol Herzberg, Pat Baldauf, Rosemary Spatafora, Bonny Heintzel, Loreen Garrison, Louise McCormick Glazier

Absent: Barb Lusk, Carole Gilbert, Jackie Considine

Comments on October's program:

Pat Baldauf commented that she really enjoyed Sarah Gallegos' program.

Vice President Scheduler - Loreen Garrison

Mileage Rates Change - The board approved Loreen's request to change our speaker's contract to state that the mileage reimbursement will be 62.5 cents per mile. This is in line with the current IRS rates for mileage.

November 19, 2022 workshop - Patricia Rapanos Sparrow Quilt workshop has 3 people signed up. Minimum is 8. Loreen will cancel the workshop.

April 23, 2023 - Tory McElwain is scheduled to present a trunk show. Awaiting signed contract.

Featherweight Maintenance Workshop, May, 2023 - Board approved \$100 for this two-hour workshop by Sew Many Things to be scheduled. Awaiting signed contract. Workshop fee for CAMEO members will be \$25/non members \$30.

November, 2023 - Donna Leinberger to teach quilting with rulers. Board approved workshop for \$30 per student. Guild can charge \$40 per member/\$50 per nonmember. Students also must purchase the rulers. Awaiting signed contract. Class size - 4 minimum/12 maximum.

Class will run from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Whistle Stop - February, 2023 - Need volunteers to do demos. Possible demos - Bonny - ruler work demo; Pat - Quilting using a serger; Carol H. requested a demo on making Flying Geese. Will ask for volunteers at the November meeting.

Treasurer's Report - Janeen reported on the amount in our bank account. Quilt retreat is paid. We have an approved budget.

Membership - Bonny reported we have 41 members.

Bylaws Committee - Carol Herzberg, Kathy Debien, and Lynda Draudt are working on the revisions. Carole Gilbert is also on this committee.

Officers Manuals - These officers currently have manuals for their positions: Janeen Sharpe for Treasurer; Pat Baldauf for VP Facilitator; Rosemary Spatafora for Corresponding Secretary; Louise McCormick Glazier - Recording Secretary

Missing officers manuals are - VP Scheduler; Assistant Treasurer, Membership, Member-at-Large manuals.

Hybrid meeting - Our October meeting was a hybrid meeting with three members attending on Zoom. CAMEO purchased a remote microphone for hybrid meetings. Everyone on Zoom reported that the reception was good. Discussion about how to handle guest fees for those attending on Zoom. Bonny will look into how a PayPal account would work.

We need to put in the newsletter that our November meeting will be a hybrid.

Zoom Account - CAMEO has a Zoom account. Janeen and Henya can set up Zoom meetings for CAMEO. Members can use CAMEO's Zoom account for any meetings related to CAMEO - i.e. sit and stitch; committee meetings; etc. Just contact Janeen or Henya with meeting date and start and end time.

Rosemary will put an article in the newsletter about this.

Meeting ended at 8:11 p.m.

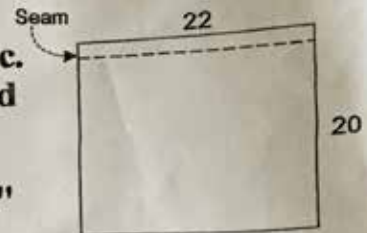

Quick Tote Bag

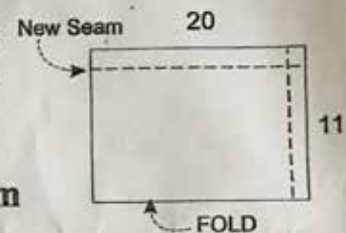

1.) Start with a pressed 20" x 22" piece of fabric. Lay fabric facing you (as shown) with the printed side of the fabric facing down.

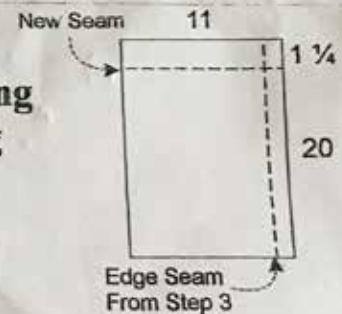


2.) Fold top down along 22" edge and press a 1/4" seam. Sew the fold down.

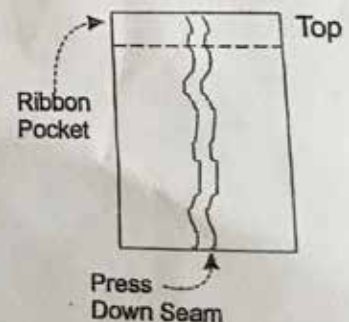
3.) Fold material (20" side to 20" side), printed side together. Sew 1/4" wide seam down the side, first stopping 1/4" down from the top. Backtack. Pick up needle and presser foot and move down the seam about 1/2". Backtack (cut tread) and continue stitching down the remainder of the seam to the bottom of the bag.



4.) Fold top edge down about 1 1/4" to form a pocket (to be used for ribbon tie). Press. Sew along bottom edge of pocket all the way around the bag (the circumference of the bag). Backtack. Cut thread.



5.) Lay bag down with seam half way in the middle. Press bag. Sew straight across bottom of bag (a 5/8" seam will work). Zigzag across the bottom seam to finish.



6.) Turn bag inside out and thread a ribbon through top pocket.* Use about 36" of 1/2" wide ribbon. (Knot the ends of the ribbon to finish.)

*Hint: Put safety pin on one end and use it to pull ribbon through pocket.

7.) Fill bag and pin girl, boy, or woman tag to lower right corner of bag.
