



Charity is gearing up for another good year. Last year we donated 43 gift bags to Haven, 25 quilts and 20 pillowcases to Orchards Children's Services, and 27 quilts to the Layette Program at Clawson Methodist Church. We would like to sponsor these charities again this year. We are also looking at donating some quilts to the Royal Oak House. This is an assisted living facility. Some of the residents do not get visitors, so it was suggested that we could give small quilts to them to let them know they have not been forgotten. What we are thinking is the quilts that are not suitable for children or teenagers could go there.

Haven Bag kits will be available at the September meeting. For those who do not know, Haven is a shelter for abused women and children. We make a Christmas bag then fill with a variety of items to help meet some of their needs. I will have directions on how to make the bags and another sheet with suggested Items to fill the bags. These bags are to be returned no later than the November meeting.



CELEBRATING OUR VETERANS

We have been contacted by an organization called Mid-Michigan Honor Flight. They take veterans from WWII, Korean, and Viet Nam to Washington DC. They are asking some of the guilds to make and donate quilts. What I would like to do is have a special sewing session to make these quilts. The quilts are small (32 X 36) so they will be easy to do in one day. They need to be in Red, White, and Blue or in camouflage. November is a good month to have a special quilting day considering November 11th is Veteran's Day.

We will be providing some quilt kits, or you may work on something of your own. We do ask that it be for this organization or Quilts of Valor. As far as food, we can brown bag it or we can get a large sub sandwich from Julian Bros. There will be a sign-up sheet at the Charity table.

Charity Day is still February 17th. Different projects will be provided on that day.
