May Program:

Weaving A Life with Janice Sullivan



I have been weaving since 1976. I will present a history of my work which will include large wall pieces, scarves and shawls in several weave structures including multi tensioned fabrics and work incorporating painted warps, double weave, and the Mormon techniques in large wall pieces. Bio: Janice Sullivan graduated with a BA in Textiles, 1979, and masters in Art Education, 1982. She taught weaving, dyeing, and tapestry at City College of San Francisco for 24 years in the Fashion Department. Her work has been exhibited locally and nationally. In her 40 years of loom manipulated, mulit-tensioned double weave, she pioneered a new approach to sculptural textiles. Her work also incorporates painting, printing, stitching and dyeing.

After 23 years in San Francisco, she moved to Fort Bragg where she maintains a weaving and dyeing studio and teaches at Pacific Textile Arts. Her work can be viewed on Instagram as Janice Sullivan Textiles.

Fiber Arts Field Trip



This March, guild members Brenda Goosby, Ellen Montalbin, Cindy Russell, and Angelina Gregorio organized a "Fiber Arts Field Trip" throughout Humboldt, Sonoma, and Mendocino Counties to check out some fiber arts-related, and other places of interest. Our three-day road trip began in Fort Bragg where we visited Pacific Textile Arts, a non-profit organization that supports and promotes textile artists and fiber arts education. PTA hosts classes and workshops, houses a gallery with rotating exhibits and a large weaving studio, and maintains an impressive library. Suzanne de Roza was a wonderful tour guide and we were treated to behind-the-scenes views of elaborate and beautiful textiles from their collections. Later that evening, our stay at the Harbor Lite Hotel provided us with scenic views of the Noyo River complete with fishing boat traffic and harbor seals.



Day Two of our itinerary took us to Healdsburg in Sonoma County where we enjoyed shopping at antique and thrift stores, as well as a store specializing in clothing made of modern and antique Japanese fabrics. In the afternoon we joined a knit-along at "Purls of Joy", a delightful yarn store where we met and chatted with a few regulars.

On our last day, we traveled north again, where we stopped in Ukiah for lunch at Jyun Kang, the popular vegetarian restaurant in the City of Ten Thousand Buddahs before visiting our last fiberthemed stop, the Mendocino Wool Mill.
