PASTOR'S MESSAGE

In our Gospel reading this weekend, we hear how Jesus sent out the twelve two by two and gave them authority over unclean spirits. We are told, "So they went off and preached repentance." This verse recalls the message of John the Baptist found in Mark 1:4, "John the Baptist appeared in the desert proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins." Repentance, the desire and action of our lives that makes a change away from sin and back to the Lord, is necessary for forgiveness. Only after his passion, death, and resurrection did Jesus give to the twelve the Holy Spirit and the grace to cooperate with God in the forgiveness of sins. Repentance still is necessary for forgiveness! There needs to be a sense of sorrow for the hurt we have brought forth by our choices. May God give us the desire to repent from our sins and to seek always the forgiveness and peace of our Lord, Jesus Christ.
