How we do things *does* matter. But that's not the real issue. The real issue is who we ARE. Are we people who are so confident in God's love and grace that we are able to try new things and welcome new people and embrace new ideas and dream new dreams? Are we clear enough about what we are being called to do and to be that we are willing to set off on whatever new adventure God calls us to?

Are we full of enough hope that we can dare to fail, to risk messing everything up, to take the chance that we are wrong? Are we free to love, to serve, to share, to sing, to laugh, to lead, to give ourselves away? Are we willing to let ourselves be turned upside-down and inside-out by a God who wants for us, for our congregations, and for our world more than anything we could ever even ask or imagine? Who ARE we? Who are YOU? How is your life being changed by God's power and presence and call? How is God changing your congregation? These are the real questions. And this is the place to begin."

Holy Communion

Beginning November 1 we will resume serving Holy Communion during worship. The safety of our members is paramount, so please follow instructions carefully.

Prepackaged sets of wafers and grape juice will be on tables in the narthex and chapel areas. Please take one



set for yourself as you enter worship. Do not open the elements until instructed to do so. You will remain in your seat during communion. Please throw used cups and plastic in the trashcans as you leave worship.

Please know that although communing with both elements (bread & wine/grape juice) is encouraged, the crucified and risen Christ is fully present in, with, and under each element. If you are only able to receive one of the elements, you have fully received Holy Communion.
