Praise the LORD, all you nations! Extol him, all you peoples! For great is his steadfast love toward us, and the faithfulness of the LORD endures forever. Praise the LORD! Psalm 117

November at Immanuel is a month of Thanksgiving. We end October with Reformation Sunday in thanks to God for those who laid the foundation of our church. Then we enter November with All Saints Sunday in gratitude for all those who have come before us in faith. We celebrate Thanksgiving with a Thanksgiving Eve meal and service coming before the Lord in praise for our many blessings. The month and the church year end with Christ the King Sunday as we pay homage to our glorious King and Lord.

The Psalms have been used by worshippers down through the ages to praise, thank, and glorify God's Holy name. The above Psalm 117, one of the psalms of Thanksgiving, is the shortest Psalm. Consisting of only two verses, it is also the shortest chapter in the whole Bible. We often praise God and give thanks for the many gifts and blessings we have received. All those freely given gifts which we could never earn on our known. But as we count our blessings, let us not forget to reserve our greatest thanks for our greatest blessing – God. As the Psalmist exclaims, "Praise the Lord . . .(f)or great is his steadfast love toward us, and the faithfulness of the LORD endures forever."

In honor of the Reformation and Thanksgiving, let us reflect on and enjoy Martin Luther's favorite Psalm, number 118. As he wrote,

"This is my own beloved Psalm. Although the entire Psalter and all of Holy Scripture are dear to me as my only comfort and source of life, I fell in love with this psalm especially. Therefore I call it my own. When emperors and kings, the wise and the learned, and even the saints could not aid me, this psalm proved a friend and helped me out of many great troubles. As a result, it is dearer to me than all the wealth, honor, and power of the pope, Turk, and the emperor. I would be most unwilling to trade this psalm for all of it." May this Psalm bring you joy and peace as we give thanks and praise to God. Amen. *Please read Psalm 118 found on page 2.*

What can mortals do to me? <sup>7</sup>The LORD is on my side to help me; I shall look in triumph on those who hate me. <sup>8</sup>It is better to take refuge in the LORD than to put confidence in mortals. <sup>9</sup>It is better to take refuge in the LORD than to put confidence in princes. <sup>10</sup>All nations surrounded me; in the name of the LORD I cut them off! <sup>11</sup>They surrounded me, surrounded me on every side; in the name of the LORD I cut them off! <sup>12</sup>They surrounded me like bees; they blazed like a fire of thorns; in the name of the LORD I cut them off! <sup>13</sup>I was pushed hard, so that I was falling, but the LORD helped me. <sup>14</sup>The LORD is my strength and my might; he has become my salvation. <sup>15</sup>There are glad songs of victory in the tents of the righteous: "The right hand of the LORD does valiantly; <sup>16</sup>the right hand of the LORD is exalted; the right hand of the LORD does valiantly." <sup>17</sup>I shall not die, but I shall live, and recount the deeds of the LORD. <sup>18</sup>The LORD has punished me severely, but he did not give me over to death. <sup>19</sup>Open to me the gates of righteousness, that I may enter through them and give thanks to the LORD. <sup>20</sup>This is the gate of the LORD; the righteous shall enter through it. <sup>21</sup>I thank you that you have answered me and have become my salvation. <sup>22</sup>The stone that the builders rejected has become the chief cornerstone. <sup>23</sup>This is the LORD's doing; it is marvelous in our eyes. <sup>24</sup>This is the day that the LORD has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it. <sup>25</sup>Save us, we beseech you, O LORD! O LORD, we beseech you, give us success! <sup>26</sup>Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the LORD. We bless you from the house of the LORD. <sup>27</sup>The LORD is God, and he has given us light. Bind the festal procession with branches, up to the horns of the altar. <sup>28</sup>You are my God, and I will give thanks to you; you are my God, I will extol you. <sup>29</sup>O give thanks to the LORD, for he is good, for his steadfast love endures forever.




### Daylight Saving ends November 5.
