October marks an important milestone for me. October 15<sup>th</sup> is the one-year anniversary of my ordination. As I was searching for a scripture for one year, the story of the fig tree popped up. So, have we, you and I, born fruit together during my first year here at Immanuel? Let us look back as we look forward.

I have enjoyed learning Immanuel's traditions. Some have remained the same and some have transformed. Advent, Lent, Ash Wednesday, and Easter services and traditions have continued. This year we added the Solemn Reproaches during Good Friday. After missing several years, the Harvest Blessing Service was brought back. Hot Times without the cars has transformed into a Missions Festival. The Living Nativity was again held with the addition of hot chocolate.

Our joint float in the Parade of Lights was representative of our evolving relationships with our sister ELCA churches. Together with Redeemer and St. John's, we have held joint services for Thanksgiving Eve, Reformation Sunday, a Longest Night Service, and God's Work Our Hands. We look forward to jointly sponsoring the Cornerstone Chorale later this month. We also hosted the Synod Professional Development Day.



And we have borne new fruit. We have been blessed to have had two baptisms, a confirmation, and a wedding. Sadly we have also experienced six funerals and memorial services. We have begun the Share Shed ministry which has grown to receive support from and serve the greater community. We have drafted an updated Constitution that has received the Bishop's approval and will be presented for vote at our next Congregational Meeting. I record and post two Bible lessons online each week for everyone's use. We have just installed an accessible entry at the north door. Later this month we will enjoy a spaghetti fund-raising dinner for the new door. We will also be adding an accessible door to the family restroom. And we have added new ways of thanking and giving each Sunday through noisy offerings, donations to the blessing boxes and Share Shed, and Thank-you Sunday.

This past year has indeed been fruitful here at Immanuel. And continuing to work together with God's blessing, the best is yet to come. I'm not too keen on the manure part, but we, like the fruit tree, can still stand some digging around and special care to become all God has created us to be. What do you see God doing here? Amen



# Cornerstone Chorale & Brass Tuesday, October 24 at 7:00 pm Redeemer Lutheran Church
