For as in one body we have many members and not all the members have the same function, so we, who are many, are one body in Christ, and individually we are members one of another. Romans 12:4-5

If the above passage sounds familiar, it may be because it is part of the lectionary for September 12. Using our God-given time, talents, and resources together to serve God and our neighbors is all part of God's purpose for us. It is called stewardship, a word that we are not always fond of, and yet it is a practice that can bring us extraordinary joy as we live out our faith. September is a month full of old and new stewardship opportunities here at Immanuel.

September 10th is God's Work, Our Hands Sunday. Together with our siblings from Redeemer and St. John's, we will have a joint worship service and service projects. The day will begin with coffee and donuts at 9:00 at St. John's followed by worship. Pastor Kim has graciously invited me to preside at the service. Our three service projects will consist of packing and delivering lunches to those living on the downtown streets, completing hygiene kits for the blessing boxes and high schools, and cleaning at Salina Grace Community Resource Center. For the service projects, we are collecting small shaving creams, hand sanitizers, and small shampoos or 3-in-1 body wash/shampoos.

Our opportunities to serve God and the community are not just limited to one day as our Stewardship Team has chosen ways to make service a part of our Sunday worship. On the 1st Sunday of every month, we will collect a noisy offering in addition to our usual offering. Bring your loose change to make plenty of noise as the kids collect the coins in coffee cans. The children will use the noisy offerings to choose an animal (Chick, rooster, honeybees, etc.) from the ELCA Good Gifts Catalog for a



needy family. On the 2nd Sunday, we will collect and bless food items for the Blessing Boxes at Redeemer and St. John's. On the 3rd Sunday, we will collect and bless items for our Share Shed. Watch and listen for a list of needed items for the Blessing Boxes and Shed.

The 4th Sunday will be a special Thank You Sunday. We will have note cards and a special "mailbox" available in the narthex. We encourage you to watch for people in our congregation that you would like to thank. Write them a note, sign your name or leave it anonymous, put it in the "mailbox," and we will quietly deliver the notes to the recipients. That leaves the occasional 5th Sunday, doesn't it? Any ideas for more ways to spread the joy of God's abundant and steadfast love as we work together as the body of Christ?

Glory to God for choosing us to be a part of God's great plan! Amen.
