A MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT *Patrick McCombs*

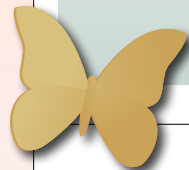

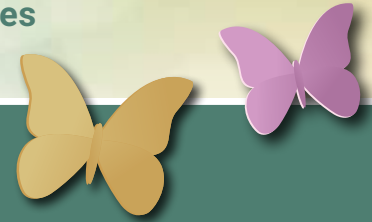

This is six-year-old **Tinkerbelle**. A very loveable and spoiled pug. She loves her treats for sure. She loves to cuddle.

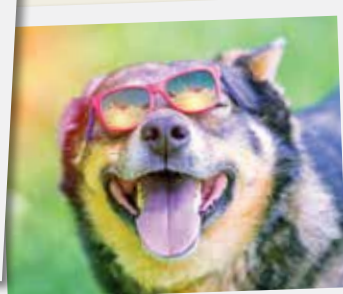

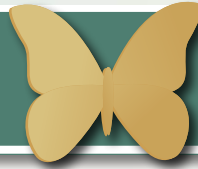

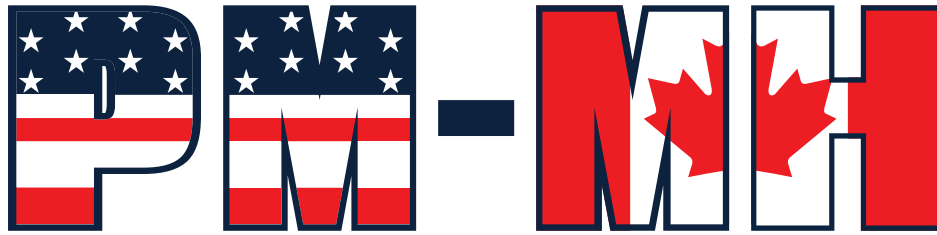
