
Provino's once again hosted the annual GGRS meeting, the food was spectacular, the clientele were, of course, their finest, and the festivities were exciting.

GGRS Plans Two Kennesaw Layouts



For several years, the **Georgia Garden Railway Society** has participated in the annual model train extravaganza at the **Southern Museum of Civil War & Locomotive History** at 2829 Cherokee Street NW, Kennesaw, Georgia 30144 (parking also available nearby at 2937 Shirley Drive). Doors open at 9:30 a.m. and close at 5:00 p.m. on Saturday January 27 and Sunday January 28.

The museum is always well maintained and hosts a variety of educational and entertaining displays as well as a well-stocked railroad themed gift store. Everything is state-of-the-art. Admission is \$10 for adults, \$8 for seniors, \$5 for children ages 3-17, and free under age 3.

On this special weekend, the museum assigns large areas of space to many model train groups to highlight their organizations. Thus, a large variety of model train scales are represented. Model train vendors do not participate in this event.

GGRS does a layout that differs each year. This year we will highlight two themes. Members Lori and Peter (GGRS Webmaster) Thomas of Dawsonville will provide a small layout featuring "Paw Patrol" characters with hands-on activity to thrill the youngsters.



Member James Bando will construct the larger track layout for a GGRS circus theme. A large circus community and collection of circus rolling stock will be provided by GGRS President Terry Manning. Members wishing to add to the circus theme with unusual pieces from their own collections are welcome and encouraged to add to the display both days or on either date.

GGRS will also host a membership table within our assigned space. Volunteers are certainly needed to help manage the layouts and the membership table. Members can help keep trains running, manage "crowd" control, recruit new members, provide break periods for other members, and meet with Executive Board members to discuss future events.

The museum's cut-off date for a list of volunteers getting a free T-shirt or free lunch was last fall on short notice, so only a few GGRS members got included. Perhaps we can create that list in July next year for January 2025.


Trains as Trash

If you recall last month's question about dumping cars into the ocean for the habitat, then this follow up is just the thing.

The Metropolitan Atlanta Rapid Transit Authority (MARTA) shipped off the first of two railcars bound for the Georgia coast and eventually the Atlantic Ocean.

MARTA is partnering with the Georgia Department of Natural Resources (DNR) Reef Project to contribute railcars from MARTA's original fleet as they are replaced by the new CQ400 railcars in coming years. The Reef Project deploys large objects to the bottom of the ocean that over time develop into reef habitats for marine wildlife.

Two older model railcars have been stripped of hazardous materials and contaminants. The dismantled railcars were then inspected and approved by the U.S. Coast Guard for deployment as artificial reef material.



Once on the coast, and when conditions are optimal, the railcars will be deployed by barge to Artificial Reef L, an established reef about two square miles in size, located approximately 23 nautical miles east of Ossabaw Island in about 55 to 65 feet of water.

Over time, the railcars will provide essential marine habitat for sea creatures, including popular sport fish and endangered sea turtles. While the substrate for the reef is manmade, the organisms that will grow on it are entirely natural and beneficial for the environment. Fish and other marine life such as sea turtles are likely to investigate the new habitat almost immediately. Corals, sponges, and other encrusting organisms will begin to take hold on the railcars in about one year and will continue to grow and improve the longer they are in the ocean. SCUBA divers and anglers can begin using the reef immediately.

The railcars will join previously deployed materials, including U.S. Army M-60 battle tanks, barges, tugboats, New York City subway cars, and other manmade structures. Artificial Reef L was first created in 1976 as part of a network of 32 offshore reefs that the Coastal Resources Division has been building for about 60 years with an estimated 3 million square feet of reef created as of 2022.



2024 G-Scale Southern Regional Get Together by Ted Yarborough


The Georgia Garden Railway Society (GGRS) is proud to announce they will host the **2024** G-Scale Southern Regional Get - Together August 23-25, 2024. The event will be centered around the 65th Atlanta Model Train Show held at the Gas South Convention Center, formerly the Infinite Energy Center, Duluth, GA on Saturday, August 24. Layout tours of GGRS garden railroads will be held on Friday, August 23 and Sunday, August 25. A special gathering for a meal will be held Saturday night August 24th at the Southeastern Railway Museum, Duluth, GA.

The Embassy Suites, Duluth, GA will be headquarters for the event. You will be able to pick up your registration packet there Thursday evening, August 22 or Friday morning, August 23. The lobby will be available to socialize Thursday and Friday evenings as well. **The special rate of \$189 for a King Studio or \$199 for a Queen Suite**, both are a short 10-minute walk to train show hall and include breakfast will be available, just follow the link on the GGRS web page to get rooms at the **2024 G-Scale Regional Get -Together rates**. Limited rooms available.

Garden railroad layout tours will be held on Friday and Sunday. GGRS members east and north of Atlanta will generally open on Friday and those south and west of Atlanta will open on Sunday. A few exceptions will be noted in the tour booklet. The tour booklet will be in your registration bag, along with a special commemorative pin. The booklet will have a brief description, physical GPS address, phone number, and photo of the garden railroads open. There are currently 12 GGRS layout plus a Train Installations shop and TRAINZ new warehouse to tour (we're still recruiting). All tours will be self-guided.

The Saturday train show, Atlanta's Oldest and Largest Model Train and Railroadiana Show, is an all-scale train show which will serve as the Vendor Hall. There will be operating layouts as well as some well-known Atlanta vendors including TRAINZ, Split Jaw, Train Installations and MELOVESTRAINS plus many other G-scale vendors. If you would like to become a vendor or exhibitor, contact Charlie Miller at

RRSHOWS@AOL.COM or 703-536-2954. There is a \$9.00 additional admission to the show (with discount coupon provided in registration bag).



Optional activities in Atlanta for Saturday include Stone Mountain Park with a 5-mile diesel train ride around the mountain, The Southern Museum featuring the 4-4-0 Civil War locomotive 'General', and the Southeastern Railway Museum with lots of locomotives and rolling stock on display. Take time after enjoying the train show to enjoy these train themed activities.

If there is enough interest, there will also be a separate purchase collectible G Scale train car. It will be a unique L & N freight car from USA Trains. Advance orders will be taken at the registration page and cars can be picked up at registration or the show.

To have the registration bags with name tags, pins, and tour booklets ready for August, we are asking for advance registration for the event. The registration will be \$25.00 per individual registration and \$35.00 per family (up to two adults and two children)

registration prior to JUNE 1, 2024. Late registration, after JUNE 1, will increase to \$40.00 per individual and \$50.00 per family registration. A registration form, for online registration payable with Zelle can be found at

Registration includes name badge(s), tour booklet, self-guided layout tours, collector's pin, discount ticket for Saturday's show admission, and opportunity to purchase special USA Trains event car and Gathering Meal tickets.



What to do when your Carolina Jasmine doesn't cooperate with your plan?

We have a raised layout railroad that is supported by PVC pipes, I find the pipes to be supportive but rather unattractive. I planted a Jasmine with plans for the vines to grow between the poles creating a natural screen that would hide the PVC poles and bloom yellow in the spring.

Great plan, but the Jasmine did not want to grow sideways. Despite trying to keep the vines up the poles with geo grid, the vines wound up

on the ground along with the geo grid.

So, we decided rather than moving the Jasmine, let the Jasmine grow upward to create a Vine Tunnel.


There has been construction in the neighborhood, so we had 4 pieces of rebar and some concrete wire laying around. The rebar made the upright supports and with the aid of the bolt cutter



the concrete wire was cut and bent to form a tunnel. We secured the concrete wire to the rebar with zip ties and wound the Jasmine through the concrete wire. Viola, we had the beginning of a Vine Tunnel.














Yard Hostler
