




The newly completed Colorado & Minnesota Family railroad, located at 5880 Cedar Ridge TRL, Cumming, Georgia was started just two years ago as a single 100-foot loop, running a single Piko starter kit steam engine.

The railroad has grown to include over 500 feet of track running across 3 independent loops of track power, as well as a separate Circus loop and Trolley track. Now running over 10 engines from LGB, USA Trains, Aristocraft, Lionel, USA Trains, and Bachmann. Throughout the layout are over 50 buildings, 25 feet of scratch-built trestle, a Koi Pond, 2 waterfalls and a river, not to

mention the 9 hole miniature golf course.

Members are welcome to bring a locomotive or entire train to run on the layout if desired. Lunch will be served, and the menu shall include pulled pork & chicken, chips, soft drinks, and tea provided by the host. Members are asked to bring sides or desserts. An area will be set up for members to bring items to sell or trade.

Please park in either the driveway, on the grass, or on the south side of the road (side opposite the house).

An added attraction will be the opportunity to tour the warehouse facility for nationally known model train retailer TRAINZ and our own Train Installations Warehouse on Friday, August 23rd where you might be able to pick up a new item for your own garden railroad. A **Dinner Get-Together on Friday night** will be a picnic buffet at the nearby Gwinnett County Bethesda Park Senior Center from 5:30 to 8:00 p.m. and will feature door prizes, raffles, and more. An enhanced G-scale vendor presence at the 65th Atlanta Model Train Show in Duluth, Georgia, on Saturday, August 24th, including a multi-table White Elephant Sale by GGRS members; and, various G-scale oriented "how-to" clinics. Confirmed vendors for this exciting one-day show include TRAINZ, Split-Jaw, *melovetrainz*, and other well know vendors.

The 2024 Southeast Region Get-Together Car is a USA Trains 40' steel box car with metal wheels. The lettering is a combination of a USA Trains 40' foot American Series box car, a USA Trains 50' Ultimate Series box car with a discrete 2024 Regional logo. The Regional Car will be offered with 4 road numbers 103803, 103804, 103805, 103806. Twenty-five of each road number will be ordered, first come first serve and reports are that about 30% of the cars are already sold!

Bargains in the Garden - White Elephant Sale

GGRS members interested in selling any of their G-gauge accessories can reserve 1 of 12 2-foot by 3-foot tabletop areas as part of a planned 3-table vendor display hosted by the Georgia Garden Railway Society on Saturday, August 24th, at the 65th Atlanta Model Train Show as part of the 2024 G-Scale Southeast Regional Get-Together. The member need not be in attendance to use one of the spaces or to set up their items, but they must be a GGRS member registered for the convention get-together. All items must be clearly marked with a sales tag that cites their last name, short item description, and selling price so any volunteer manning the tables can sell an item without reference to the owner. Items must be functional and undamaged or marked "As Is" with a description of any defect. Items without this information will be removed from the sales tables. Any item sold at a lower price will be marked as such since the sales tag and all sales proceeds will be combined together. Each member will be returned their items and sales proceeds after the show. Unsold items may be placed for sale at the next one or two scheduled GGRS meetings if desired. Unsold items not retrieved within 60 days become the property of GGRS.

Members are <u>limited to one such slot per family</u> and must reserve the slot prior to July 14 (the day after our July membership meeting) with a \$20 donation to "GGRS" given to White Elephant Coordinator Terry Manning (temanning@aol.com). A space can be "built up" by stacking items such as boxed rolling stock or using a crate or something similar to create a raised shelf and may also use the floor space beneath their slot (thus doubling their available space). Unsold spaces will be used to enlarge paid spaces.

Participation is on a paid first-come basis to the first 12 participants. Items for sale need not be provided at time of payment reservation. Payment will not be included as a line item on the registration form but can be included in the same mailing as your registration form with the following information. Last Call: 1:1 Scale Train Ride June 22

The GGRS 1:1 Scale Train Ride will take place on Saturday, June 22 when the Tennessee Valley Railroad's Summerville Steam Special departs at 9:00am from Grand Junction Depot, 4119 Cromwell Road, Chattanooga, Tennessee. Boarding starts at 8:15. This 9-hour excursion is planned to be pulled by historic Southern Railway Locomotive #4501. The trip will pass through the pre-Civil War Missionary Ridge tunnel, cross a couple high bridges, pass by the National Cemetery while skirting around the edge of Chattanooga before passing into Georgia and going through Rossville, Chickamauga, Rock Springs, and Lafayette prior to arriving at Summerville. The locomotive will turn on the turntable in Summerville and pull the train back to Chattanooga. Riders will exit the train for about 1 hour in Summerville to watch the locomotive on the turntable and visit the historic depot. The steam train will arrive back in Chattanooga at approximately 6:00pm.



Our tickets will be in a standard 1940's to 50's era passenger coach. A special 10:30 lunch will be served to our group in the dining car. Ticket cost is \$105.00 per ticket. Everyone

riding the train must have a ticket. This train will sell out, so we must reserve early. To order, send a check made out to Ted Yarbrough to Ted Yarbrough, 212 Love Drive, Chatsworth, Georgia, 30705. Deadline for your ticket order to be received is April 22 (we have only 12 of our original

20 tickets remaining). Please note that tickets are non-refundable, but can be sold or transferred to other GGRS members or friends if for some reason you are not able to attend.

Want a ride on a motorcar? Enjoy a first class railroad museum? Spenser, NC is a great trip you might want to consider.






GGRS April Meeting at the Chatsworth Depot



Registration desk




Are you a fan of RBP Trains? It's hard not to be. Don't worry, he's not leaving the hobby but some of his collection could be yours!
