


Armstrong Turntable. Did you know that there are turntables that turn 1:1 Engines that are powered by humans in the same way? That takes some incredibly well balanced bearings. 





What are Tier 4 locomotives and what are their computers capable of?

Tier 4 locomotives are equipped with super computers that allow them to process massive amounts of data which allows them to improve operational and fuel efficiency. The units have 15 million lines of computer code, five times that of its predecessor.

"Tier 4" refers to a U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) emission-level standard that went into effect for new locomotives on January 1, 2015. Tier 4 locomotives earned their name because they comply with these emissions standards and reduce emissions by 90 percent compared to locomotives manufactured before the year 2000. This makes them the most fuel - efficient locomotives to date.
