### **Hot & Flustered Cows**

Data from DairyNZ suggests that in summer, even in this part of New Zealand, each day cows get hot enough to reduce their milk production for 1-2 hours, probably totaling 1-2kgMS per cow over the season. The three simplest strategies to minimise the impact of heat stress are:

• Install water troughs on the exit race, so that every cow has ample opportunity to get a good drink when

she is likely to be hottest

 Hose the yard shortly before the cows arrive. As the water evaporates, it cools the concrete

 Change milking times to avoid the hottest part of the day. 3-in-2 with cups on at 5am, 6pm and 11am works well on many farms



### **Putting Cattle Out To (Past The) Pasture**

As mating is finishing up and scanning is underway, now is the time where many bulls and cull cows are up for the chopping block. In some cases, these animals need vet certification to be legally fit for transport. Sending pictures and videos of the animal to your vet if you're unsure whether it needs a cert can be very helpful. The animal also needs an area it can be adequately examined and restrained for video recording. A hard surface will help assess lameness and will mimic how they will look at the works. The animal will also need to be able to be clearly identified, spray paint goes a long way. It's important to book in a vet as soon as you can after securing a spot on the truck as it can take a day or two for a certification to be approved by the meat works vets when it's not clear-cut case. Vet certs can be valid for up to 7 days. The truckies also appreciate knowing there will be a cert on board a head of time as it can change their run with specific vet cert conditions.

These conditions can include;

- Direct to slaughter premises
- · Last on the truck and first off
- Reduced stocking density
- Lower deck only

It's important to remember that a cert for transport does not guarantee fitness for consumption, that call is made at the works. If the animal is unfit for transport, other options include;



- Vet treatment (e.g. dehorning ingrown horns, removal of cancer eyes and masses) or euthanasia
- Pet food or home kill

# Things to do in February

- Weigh the calves, to ensure weight gains are maintained on dry feed. Supplements may be required
- Maintain regular worm drenching of calves
- Lepto vaccinations—calves, yearlings and herd
- Condition score the herd, and adjust feeding and milking strategies for light cows
- Pregnancy testing, to allow early dry off or culls
- Vet certs for bulls or cows heading to the works with any abnormality (within a few days of them going
- Book in for our lame cow workshop on 1st March
- Get all of your RVM paperwork in order for shed checks—this will also be necessary for upcoming autumn consults and DCT discussions
