For many children, teens, and adults in our community the coming of fall means time to hit the books. Can you remember learning to read? I can remember being so anxious to understand those mysterious symbols on the page. Learning to read can be a magical and frustrating experience. Just when you master one reading level and breathe a sigh of accomplishment the teacher presents you with more challenging text. As much as I wanted to understand all those letters and words by 3rd grade it was obvious that my "brain was different." There were many days I sent my books flying through the air. September Mission Packs of Hope

Packs of Hope, a community mission to feed bodies, minds and souls

Jesus has taught us to take care of the less fortunate.

To help in our community, the NMUMC evening women's group has made a commitment to continue to provide weekend/school holiday food packages (Packs of Hope) throughout the school year to students of New Market Middle and Elementary Schools. Last Spring we served 22 students. This year we will be helping up to 30 students who will be referred by their school counselors. The program begins in August with the start of school. Packs of Hope will be the recipient of September's mission offering. In addition, fund raisers are being considered to underwrite this mission.

However, we would like to offer opportunities for regular contributions. If you would like to "adopt" a student for a month, semester or year, we will let you know what amount would be needed. It is estimated that each weekend food package will cost about \$2.60 and contain snack and dinner foods. There are 41 weekends in the school year. This includes 10 long/holiday weekends, at an additional \$.75/day.

The total cost of the program for all students for the year will be approximately \$3,325.00 You may write checks to New Market United Methodist Church, put Packs of Hope on the memo line, then put the check in the offering plate or mail to NMUMC, P.O. Box 111, New Market, MD 21774. Contributions will be welcome not only in September but throughout the year.

The women in the evening circle are very enthusiastic about this mission program and invite you to partner with them in doing what Jesus would have us do.


- 1) Altar rail and spindles painted
