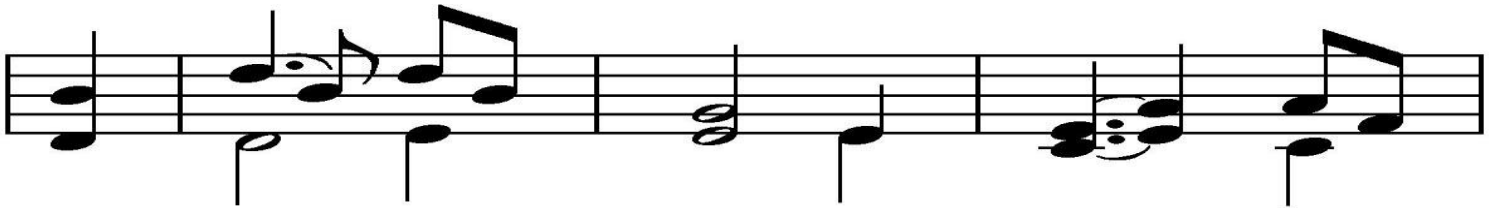

Mr. T the guidance counselor at New Market Elem. has also shared how 12 student families greatly appreciated the Packs of Hope.

The Packs of Hope consist of a snack and dinner food for a student to have over the weekend, the students will receive the packs on Friday school days in May and June.

Right now each Hope Pack costs \$2.30 per student for a weekend. “The Lofty Ladies” mission for the end of the school year will cost a total of \$303.60. 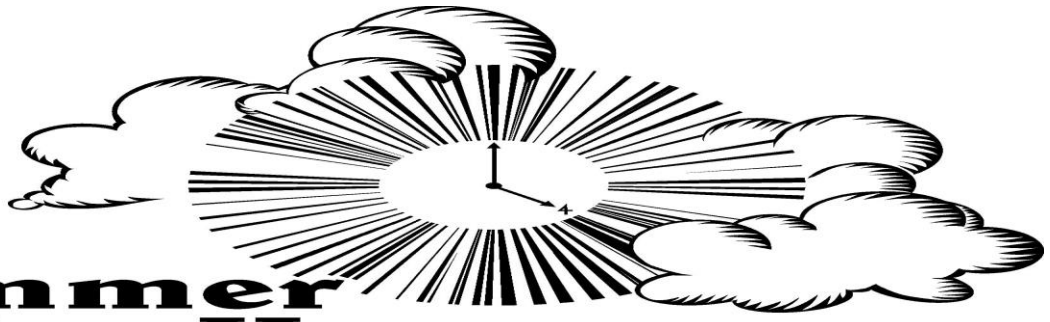

Update on Capitol Campaign

The finance committee would like to thank everyone for their gracious giving during the first portion of the year. We are pleased to announce that giving has met the budgeted amount for the first 5 months of the year and the Capitol Campaign as of May 5th has raised \$14,705.00. The Capital Campaign pledge amount for 2014 was \$15,285.00 and the memorial contributions to the building fund were \$3,468.00. This gives us a grand total of \$18,173.00 in the building fund to date. The first ministry focused project, painting of the sanctuary will start June 9th at a cost of \$11,000.00 and partial repair of the parking lot will start also in June at the cost of \$6,000.00. We encourage everyone to continue with their generosity to the general fund and the building fund. Full finance reports are available in the rear of the sanctuary.
