### Men's Day Apart (Antietam Battlefield) July 27, 2013

From James M. McPherson's Crossroads of Freedom:

Asked about the meaning of Antietam, the surgeon of a New Hampshire regiment, who remained in the vicinity of Sharpsburg for more than a month to treat the wounded, could find no answer: "To the feeling man this war is truly a tragedy but to the thinking man it must appear a madness," he wrote. "We win a great victory. It goes through the country. The masses rejoice, but if all could see the thousands of poor, suffering, dying men their rejoicing would turn to weeping.... I pray God may stop such infernal work--though perhaps he has sent it upon us for our sins. Great indeed must have been our sins if such is our punishment."

# Scouting News



Remember what it was like to be a Scout? The adventures, challenges, friends, and fun? Even if you weren't a Scout, you know what they stand for: character, confidence, leadership, and great memories. Your **July mission donation** will go to support the church's two scouting programs, Boy Scout Troop 628 and Cub Scout Pack 1628. Our goal is for the scouting program we provide to be available for all boys. Your mission donations will be set aside to help boys from families with financial needs join and stay in scouting by providing scholarships for scouting activities so that all of our boys can make great memories and "put the outing in scouting".

Pack 1628 currently serves 30 Cub Scouts ranging from grade 1 through grade 5 and has 15 registered leaders and many supportive parents that make the pack go. Five boys from Pack 1628 bridged to Boy Scout Troops in March of this year. The pack provides several family camping opportunities for the scouts. In the summer, boys can go to day camp, Cub Scout Resident Camp, or Webelos Resident Camp.

Troop 628 has recently grown to over 50 scouts that range from 12 through 18 years old. In 3 short years, we have had five boys progress to the rank of Eagle and have several more that are well on their way to attaining this honor. The troop has approximately 40 registered and trained adults that provide guidance and support to our boys. The Boy Scouts have countless camping, hiking, and boating opportunities through the year. Many of our boys attend a week long summer camp to work on merit badges and build camaraderie.

Both groups of young men provide cheerful service to the community in many ways. Both groups made contributions to the recent Talent and Service Auction and are involved in the Scouting for Food program in the fall. The Pack has helped the Town of New Market with a landscaping project on the east end of town and have decided to make it a recurring project. The Troop recently completed an Eagle project outside of the Schoolhouse that included erecting an event sign, rebuilding a bench, and landscaping. Our boys and leaders were also a very vital part of the landscaping project to complete the Mount Carmel parking lot.

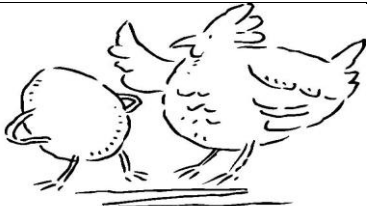

### FIRST PLACE: What takes First Place in Your Family?

As you make your plans for fall we invite your family to ask this question around the dinner table. This is the time for registering for fall sports, making commitments for community activities, signing up for groups etc. Now is the time to consider how you keep God and family time at the top of your priorities. Many in our church family have shared that Sunday sports and community obligations have caused them to miss church and lose quality family time. Many families share that they rarely get to share a meal together. We invite you to consider how you can lower your stress, teach your children that worship is a special time in the week, and foster a healthier home environment. Here are a few tips:

1. ASK! Before you sign up for a sports team or activity ask if they have Sunday morning obligations. If they do seek out a different organization.
2. Choose **One** for a balanced life! Many families are sharing how stretched thin they are. We were not created for thinness, we were created for health. Choosing one sports team, or one activity to savor rather than rushing from one to the other can be a freeing experience. You are worth it!
3. Make a date with those most important! Rather than filling every space with activities make a date with God every Sunday morning and make a date for family dinner at least once each week!
4. Listen to your body and the voices in your family. If you hear "I am tired, I am weary, I am stressed..." It's time to put your health, your family, and your faith back in **FIRST PLACE!**

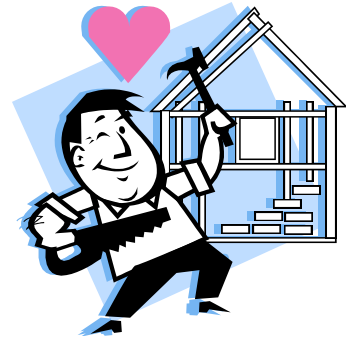

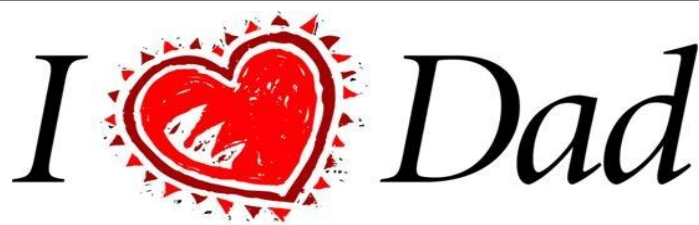

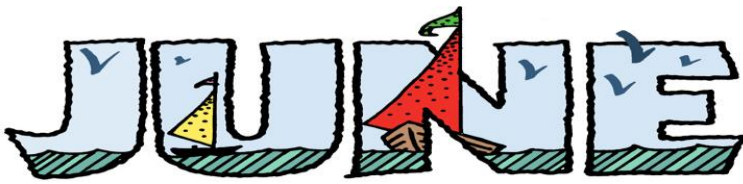
