Lent 2023

Lent is a powerful time of blessing for us as we *rediscover* our identity and being through God in Christ Jesus. I love how the late Henri Nouwen describes a blessing ... "A blessing happens when God says 'yes' to our Belovedness." I want to personally encourage all of you to receive a very special blessing of being in community and participating in that community here at Bethlehem. This year we will be offering two different Lenten opportunities for us to partake.

First, beginning on Ash Wednesday (February 22nd) and continuing through March 29th we will be gathering with some of our sister ELCA congregations for worship *on Wednesdays at 11:00 am at Bethlehem*. We will also gather together on Good Friday at 11:00 am. The services will feature dramatic presentations from various folks in our congregations as they depict characters that experienced Jesus' knowing and loving eyes, to include: the Tax Collector, the Woman at the Well, Simon the Pharisee, the desperate Canaanite Mother, and others ... After worship join us for lunch as we enjoy some soup in the Fellowship Hall.

Second, we will offer our *regular Wednesday evening* opportunities for worship beginning Ash Wednesday through March 29th. Join us for a soup and sandwich supper beginning at 5:30 pm followed by worship at 6:20 pm. Following Ash Wednesday, we will be utilizing the liturgy, *That You May Have Life*, written by Marty Haugen and Susan Briehl. I will be leading a time of *Dwelling in the Word* as we listen, meditate, and reflect together on the Epistles of Lent through the Apostle Paul.

I am looking forward to being with you as we celebrate the blessings of Life in Christ together!



CREATION CARE

In addition to less-polluting technologies for extracting lithium for lithium-ion batteries, and recycling and reuse of current batteries, researchers are also working to develop alternatives to the lithium-ion battery. Chemical engineers at the University of Michigan have announced the design of a lithium-sulfur battery that could quintuple EV ranges on a single battery charge. The National Science Foundation recently awarded a grant to research sodium-ion batteries, because sodium is considerably cheaper and more widely available than lithium. Partnering with BMW and Ford, Solid Power, a Colorado company, recently started a pilot project to produce solid-state batteries, which promise to significantly extend EV ranges. The ability to store more energy using less material than lithium-ion batteries makes the solid-state battery the most significant development of all: it means less mining and the prospect of creating a higher ratio of recycled materials.




