Scripture Reading: Liturgist: Todd Sutter

Liturgist: We now turn our hearts and minds to the reading of God's Holy Scripture. Today we are reading from the Gospel according to Luke, chapter 24, verses 36-48 where Jesus tells his disciples that they are witnesses for the world of his love and power.

Let us pray: Holy One, bless us now in the hearing of your Holy Scripture so that we might hear your call to be witnesses for Christ during this season of Easter and always. We pray this in his name. Amen.

Reading:

Some of the disciples were talking amongst themselves, when all of a sudden, Jesus himself stood among them. He said to them, "Peace be with you." They were startled and terrified, and thought that they were seeing a ghost.

He said to them, "Why are you frightened, and why do doubts arise in your hearts? Look at my hands and my feet; see that it is I myself. Touch me and see; for a ghost does not have flesh and bones as you see that I have." And when he had said this, he showed them his hands and his feet.

While in their joy they were disbelieving and still wondering, he said to them, "Have you anything here to eat?" They gave him a piece of broiled fish, and he took it and ate in their presence – proving to them that he was, indeed, as real as they were.

Then he said to them, "These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you—that everything written about me in the law of Moses, the prophets, and the psalms must be fulfilled."

Then he opened their minds so that they could more fully understand the scriptures. And he said to them, "Thus it is written, that the Messiah is to suffer and to rise from the dead on the third day, and that repentance and forgiveness of sins is to be proclaimed in his name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem.

You are the first to hear this and see it for yourselves. You are witnesses of these things. What comes next is very important: I am sending what my Father promised to you, so stay here in the city until he arrives, until you're equipped with power from on high."

Liturgist: Here ends the read of God's Holy Scripture. May God bless us with understanding, and may we show our understanding in the way we live our lives. Amen.
