OUR AREA HAS SOME SERIOUS ISSUES & WE NEED YOUR HELP! NOW!

1/ The Progressive Conservative (PC) government under Doug Ford just recently imposed eMZO's (Emergency Minister Zoning Order) on the Langstaff development just west of Bayview Ave. and south of Hwy. 407, as well as for properties in Richmond Hill off High Tech Rd. The MZO <u>takes away the</u> <u>decision making and rights</u> for qualified and effective planning from the City of Markham and the City of Richmond Hill.

Vote for a party that will REVERSE THE eMZO's imposed by the PC's!

The PC's are calling these 2 locations TOC's (Transit Oriented Communities) where the subway and GO trains will have 2 stations. The Cities had creative designs for affordable housing which thanks to the totalitarian methods of the PC's, will be replaced by...

double the housing density, and CUT future job opportunities, and CUT affordable housing, and CUT parkland, and CUT schools, and NO community centres. The two communities will house 80,000 people (the population of Newmarket), in 67 condo towers, 11 of which will be 80 floor skyscrapers, (taller than First Canadian Place's 72 floors), in a 3 block radius (half the area of Exhibition Place). At 175,000 inhabitants/sq.km., this will make it the densest housing centre in the Western Hemisphere and the second densest in the world, second only to the Dharavi slums of Mumbai. And of the expected 40,000 vehicles coming out of these towers, the traffic spilling onto Bayview Ave. and Yonge St. will fully gridlock the already terrible traffic jams on those 2 roads.

Need for additional employment, park space, civic uses, emergency services, infrastructure capacities, etc. And as the PC's force this massive residential density on Thornhill and Richmond Hill, farmland in our area which we've been relying on to feed us will be at a premium.... But the Ford PC's are intent on **building Highway 413** just north of us which will **pave over a couple thousand hectares of that precious farmland**. The highway will also encourage more sprawling sub-division growth nearby. Covid has shown that the unthinkable can happen.

When the Ontario PC's usurp the powers of the local Markham and Richmond Hill cities, (and other cities as well) without their agreement, that is a totalitarian (dictatorship) approach to governing which should not exist in the Canadian democratic way of 'governing by the people'.



2/ ACTION PENDING: DEVELOPMENTS, DEVELOPMENTS



AWRA and also other Ward 1 Residents' groups have joined forces under a common banner to speak with one LARGE voice. Since the beginning of 2020, our volunteers have had to focus almost 100% of our efforts on issues surrounding the following inappropriate massive developments proposed for our area...

- Liberty Developments the Shouldice Hospital property
- Hazelview Developments Thornhill Square property
- Langstaff Gateway TOC Developments on Langstaff between Yonge & Bayview

Because these projects will have overlapping **severe** impacts on the unarguable traffic congestion, overuse of the Thornhill Community Centre, the loss of green space, reduce commercial and retail services, etc., etc., we've been studying the evolving development applications, making repeated deputations, attending lots of meetings, and communicating with the Mayor, City staff and Councilors to get the following...

- Markham needs to create a Thornhill Centre Sub-Committee with all major stakeholders represented, including the impacted ratepayers' groups, developers, planners, etc., who will...
- **Help create a new Thornhill Secondary Plan**, replacing the one created in 1987 (partly revised in 1995)... to better reflect the realities of Ward 1, and will work to get...
- Markham to pass an interim control bylaw to halt further planning work on these developments for up to 12 months, while...


Currently, the Council is in discussion with the developers, trying to come to some resolution which we hope will be sooner than later.

3/ CALL-TO-ACTION NEEDED: HUNTINGTON TRAIL BRIDGE REPAIR





The formal Maple Valley trail system access point on Ravencliffe Rd. has been delayed **pending the rebuild of the Huntington Trail ramp** over the culvert system for the German Mills Creek north of Evergreen Cres. This ramp falls within the governance of Infrastructure Ontario (IO), an agency of the provincial government.

The community has been trying to get action on this for the last 2 years!

Despite a willingness on the part of the City of Markham to proceed with replacing the Huntington Park Pathway Bridge this year, the landowner Infrastructure Ontario has refused the offer. They now intend to do the work themselves, but progress is slow.

The City of Markham leases Huntington Park from them. As the landowner, IO has this right.

AWRA has consulted closely with Councilor Irish and together we agree the time has come to mobilize the community in an email campaign to IO.


