

## A MESSAGE FROM FATHER PAUL ABERNATHY

So, What If?

My Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Last year, in our June issue of our *Epiphany Star*, I shared this schematic of our church year. I do so again, for I think it wonderfully illustrates that our church year is divided roughly in half.



The first half runs from Advent (preparing for Jesus' arrival in his birth and in his second coming), Christmas (celebrating his birth), **Epiphany** (proclaiming that Jesus is the Messiah for the whole world), **Lent** (following Jesus on his journey to Jerusalem to fulfill his destiny of crucifixion and death), Easter (celebrating his

resurrection), to the **Day of Pentecost**, this year, falling on June 9 (celebrating the fulfillment of Jesus' promise to send his continuing presence through the Holy Spirit).

During the first half of the church year, we retell the story of Jesus. During the second half of the church year, the story of the people of God (aka the Season after the Day of Pentecost), we have an extended period to reflect on the story of Jesus.

**So, what if**, to guide our *daily* individual and communal reflections on the Jesus-story, we turn the seasons of the church year into verbs, specifically, infinitives?

To Advent means that we reflect on how Jesus coming into our lives.

To Christmas means that we reflect on how Jesus is born in us.

To Epiphany means that we reflect on how we, in word and deed, proclaim Jesus to the world.

To Lent means that we reflect on how we follow Jesus in his life of self-sacrifice.

To Easter means that we reflect on how we are raised to new life.

To Day of Pentecost means that we reflect on how the Holy Spirit empowers us for ministry.

Happy reflecting!
