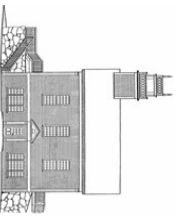

It is such an honor to be part of a giving community
 which is supportive and generous to the Danbury Community
 Center. We can't mention everyone or all the different programs
 and events so many of you have volunteered for and supported.
 DCC had over several events and programs, bi-weekly, weekly,
 monthly, several times a year and yearly. We will be looking at

2019 Dog License Renewal Begins January 1st

The Town of Danbury Requires all dogs four months and older be licensed before April 30th. Regardless of when the license is obtained, the license is valid from May 1st of each year to the following April 30th. The cost to license a dog is \$9.00 for a male or female, \$6.50 for a spayed or neutered dog and \$2.00 for a senior citizen over 65 years of age. If a puppy is too young to be altered the \$6.50 fee will apply for the first license. Please bring proof of rabies with you.

Happily, our library is visited by only creatures of the second definition, however, we do currently have visitors of the first variety.... sort of. Our extremely talented friend of the library, Phyllis Rockwell, has created, out of old books, amazing little nooks for little clay bookworms to nestle and pursue their favorite activity, reading. Come and see one of the many uses for outdated books.

An article in the latest AARP Bulletin is titled “99 Ways to Add Healthy Years to Your Life”. One of the ways it suggests is to go to the library, stating that “A study of 3,635 older adults found that book readers had a 23-month survival advantage and 20 percent lower mortality risk compared with nonreaders. Reading was protective regardless of gender, education or health.” At the George Gamble Library we have focused on creating a library that is a welcoming place for meeting friends and sharing thoughts, as well as providing a variety of books for reading pleasure and education. It is especially gratifying to know that we are also offering you the opportunity to add healthy years to your life!!

March 1st is National Read Across America Day, which is part of a project created by the National Education Association in 1997 to provide special focus on the importance of reading in a child’s education. Special school programs and activities are encouraged on the school day closest to the March 2nd birthday of Dr. Seuss. You are invited to the library on Saturday, March 2nd to celebrate the birthday of this wonderful author. Borrow a Dr. Seuss book to read with your child and laugh together at the always clever, sometimes silly, rhyming stories. Children will receive their own Dr. Seuss ABC poster. Let’s all take the time to remind our children that Dr. Seuss says “The more that you read, the more things you will know. The more that you learn, the more places you’ll go.” (from the book “I Can Read With My Eyes Shut”)
