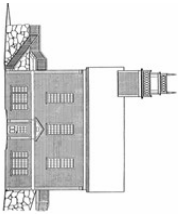

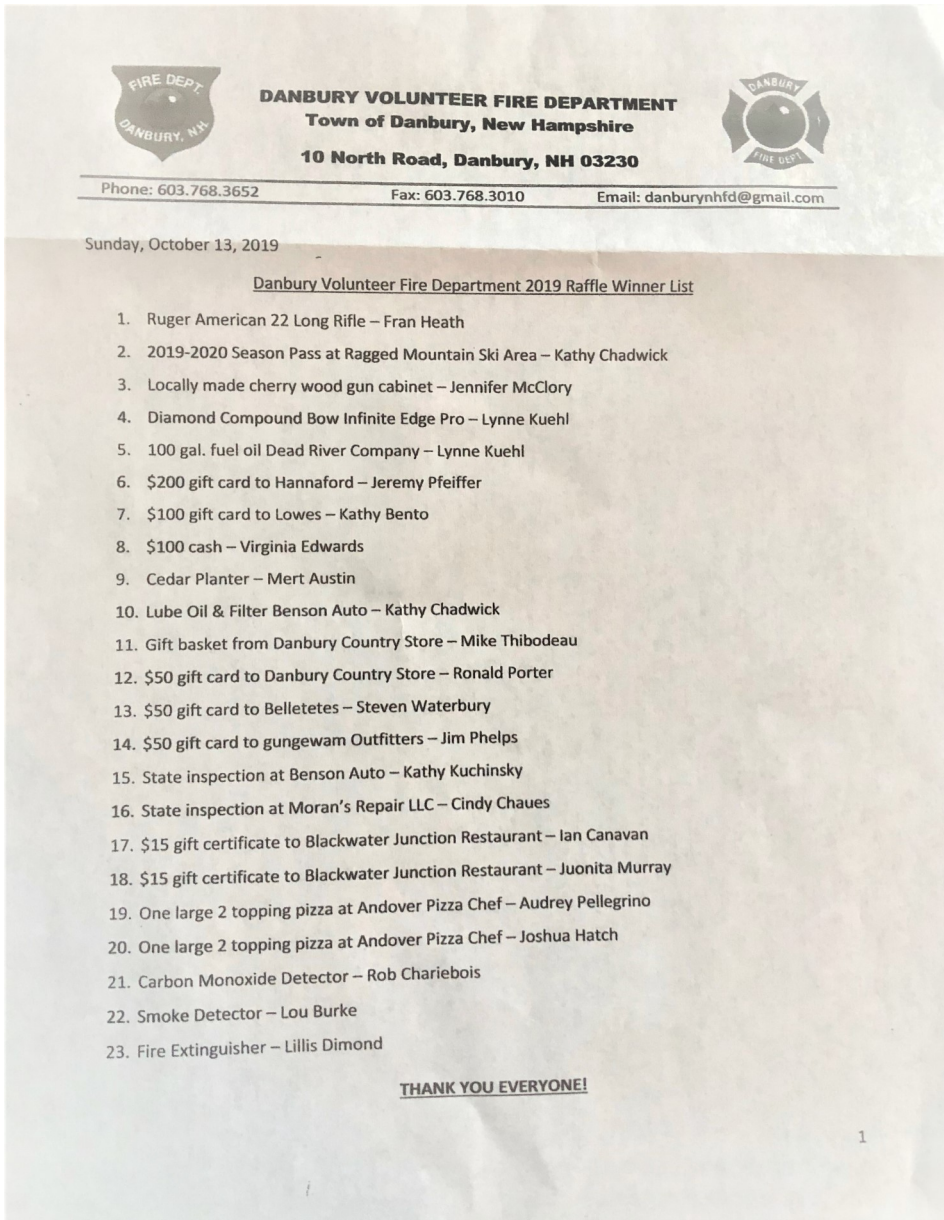

Library News November 2019




November is a month of days full of interesting historic events. On the 30th in 1782, the United States and Great Britain signed a peace treaty in Paris, formally ending the Revolutionary War. On the 19th in 1863, Abraham Lincoln delivered the Gettysburg Address. FDR formed the Civil Works Administration to create jobs for millions of workers unemployed during the Great Depression on the 8th in 1933. Significant in the daily lives of some of us is the fact that Clarence Birdseye began marketing frozen peas on the 3rd in 1952 and Sesame Street premiered on PBS November 10th 1969. I know someone who was sure he would successfully pass his GED testing because he had watched Sesame Street regularly.....and he did.

Of course the real focus of the month is Thanksgiving, a day first celebrated between the Pilgrims and the Native Americans in 1621 to give thanks for a plentiful fall harvest. Usually observed in late September or October and only occasionally, it did not become a yearly national holiday until 1941 when Congress set the date as the fourth Thursday in November. If your feast includes all the traditional fixings, you may have leftover turkey and vegetables. The library has a good selection of cookbooks that can inspire a variety of ways to use such leftovers. You may also pick up copies of a Turkey and Dressing Recipe that is "a meal all by itself".




During this month of sharing and giving thanks, the Trustees, Friends, and Librarian of the George Gamble Library would like to extend a special thank you to you all for the support that you give us, by borrowing books, donating books, volunteering time, stopping in to be 'counted' and by spreading the word that Danbury has its very own public library, our own library which is a NH historic location.

We wish you all a wonderful holiday of sharing and feasting with family and friends.
