AGM: a cautious yes to satellite dishes

The Fieldend AGM was held on Wednesday 8 Feb at the Alexander Pope Hotel. Alongside the usual AGM business the matter of satellite dishes was discussed and a vote taken. The question put to the vote was whether satellite dishes should be permitted at Fieldend subject to board approval.

There was vigorous debate with strong opinions being expressed that any dishes permitted should not be visible and, therefore, not impact the appearance of Fieldend.

The vote (postal and in person) passed by a narrow margin of 17 to 13 with 1 abstention.

Board to draft guidelines

Because the vote was so close, the Board have decided not to implement the decision immediately but to draft guidelines that will set out the conditions under which dishes will be permitted, e.g. on the condition that unused television aerials are removed (a suggestion made at the AGM).

If residents have any suggestions for guidelines to be included, please submit these in writing to a member of the Board.

The Board will circulate draft guidelines to the residents for comment as soon as possible.

- After a long campaign to stop fly tipping in Fieldend, we would like to remind residents that they are responsible for their own household waste and that the communal areas of Fieldend should not be used for 'storage'.
- Richmond Council publishes lots of information about what they will take from the kerbside and what can be recycled at the local dump (Townmead Road, Richmond, TW9 4EL)
- be recycled at the local dump. Did you know that you can recycle the following items: CDs (collected and sent for re-use), cooking oil (collected and used in the manufacture of biodiesel), electrical equipment (if these cannot be reused, they will be broken down and their parts recycled). A full list of items that can be recycled can be found on the Council's website.
- If any residents need help taking items to the dump, think about using "Give an Hour / Gain an Hour" to ask for help.

What the Council will take from the kerbside (on Friday)...

The following will <u>not</u> be collected and will contaminate your waste meaning that the whole load may not be collected: Soil, stone, wood, food, rubble, animal waste, glass or BBQ ash.
