The Entrance Road

The Council turned down our request for a Home Zone style revamp of the entrance road on the grounds of costs. Hardly surprising given the amount of road repairs they have had to do following last winter. They have, however, resurfaced the entrance and reinstated the yellow lines and have told us that they have advised the Parking Enforcement Department to ensure that the lines are enforced - so some positive progress at least.

By the way, we haven't forgotten about the additional lighting along the entrance path, but George Hammond has been very busy recently and is now on Jury Service. It might be that we will now delay this work until after the Party.

Garden Refuse Area



Things were going so well, but sadly, in recent months we have seen another increase in non-garden rubbish being left in the Garden Refuse Area – rubbish which Allen has to spend his time and your money removing. In the face of increasing costs, the Board have therefore reluctantly decided to close this area. Allen

will now rent a large bin exclusively for his own use and the 2 large green bins hired from the Council and emptied every two weeks will still be available. If anyone has any larger items of garden waste, they will need to take them to the Kew Re-cycling Centre.

We would also like to remind everyone that if they have work done by an outside contractor it is the Resident's responsibility to ensure that they, or their contractor, remove all building materials and rubbish from Fieldend on completion of the work.
