#### Heathrow Runway Trial Continues

Phase II of the Heathrow Operational Freedom Trail started on 1<sup>st</sup> July and will continue until 31<sup>st</sup> March 2013. As reported in the last newsletter, the government is testing ways to increase the efficiency of air traffic. The matters under test mainly involve aircraft landing to both runways instead of just one; taking off along

new routes and some changes to the night flight arrangements (from November). More information is available on the Council's website where you can also leave comments/complaints.

Smartphone users can now download the 'Widenoise' app to measure the noise of aircraft flying overhead.
