    - o Dropoff: Friday, May 17th 4-7pm
      - Dropoff: plants, tables, raffle items, garden shop items.
    - o Setup: Saturday, May 18th 6:30-8:30am
    - o Plant Sale: Saturday, May 18th 8:30-12pm
  - Directions to members:
    - Each member brings: ~10 plants.
    - Plants to bring: Veggies, herbs, and annuals (along with perennials and houseplants). No invasive plants.
    - Bring plants in: Plastic pots (containers that plants come in; if you need some, nurseries have extras).
    - Divide, grow, or purchase plants: Start growing or dividing plants in your garden now so they are thriving by the sale. Idea: buy a ~\$4 flat of plants, repot them and put them into bigger pots.
    - Must have a labeled stick with:
      - 1/Name of Plant
      - 2/Perennial or Annual
      - 3/Color (if applicable)
      - 4/Indoor or Outdoor
      - 5/Sun or Shade
      - 6/Mark as Native (if applicable)
