Dear T'ai Chi Chih Community,

These lines are being composed on a return flight from Minnesota to New Jersey after sharing the extended weekend with 16 teachers and 9 students during a much focused time considering the form along with the retreat theme: Gift, Grace, Gratitude.

"T'ai Chi Chih is a service to humanity. It is a form of love." Justin Stone.

This very familiar quote of Justin's is printed on the cover of the Vital Force and one that he liked to refer to when speaking of the teachers and T'ai Chi Chih.

In this month of February when so many are aware of St. Valentine's Day on the 14th, we may want to consider this quote and what we are involved in when teaching the T'ai Chi Chih form and being faithful to our daily T'ai Chi Chih practice.
