

Dogwood Trees 2024



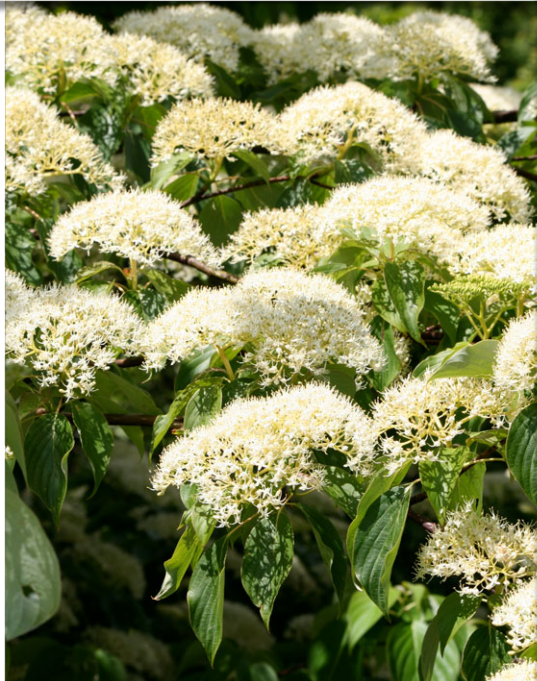
June Snow *Cornus controversa*

Fast growing and wide spreading, with branches developing a horizontally tiered appearance. Flat topped clusters of white flowers often exceed 6" in diameter.

Outstanding fall color; mottled orange-yellow, red, and purple-red.

Size: 30ft tall x 40wide

Hardy: Zone 5 (-20 degrees)

Mountain Moon (*Cornus capitata*)

Common Name: Evergreen Moon Dogwood

For the milder parts of the country this evergreen dogwood is a real show stopper. The foliage is deep green and contrast very well with the large, rounded, overlapping white bracts which nearly obscure the foliage. Easily trained to very nice tree form. Fine with strong winds and not bothered by pests.

Zones: 7-10

Height: 15-20

Spread: 15-20

Light Needs: Full Sun

Flowering Season: Early

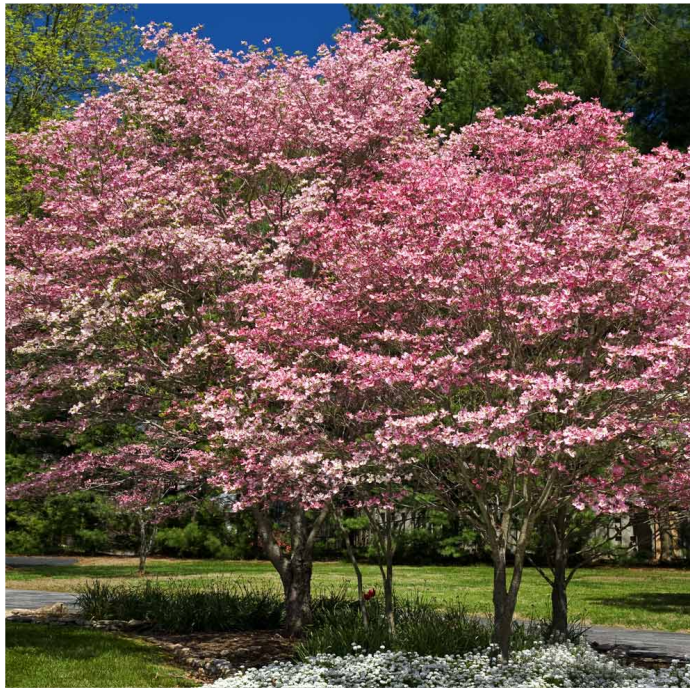

Cherokee Brave (cornus florida)

Big blossoms have an interesting red glow that fades to a white center. Blooms earlier in the spring than many other dogwoods and they also leaf-out earlier shaking off the gray days of winter. Come fall the leaves turn a beautiful shade of maroon that really lights up the garden. After the leaves fall you're left with red berries and soft grey bark that is striking in the winter landscape and provides food for birds and other wildlife.

Grows: 20 - 30ft tall x 25 - 30ft wide in full sun to part shade

Hardy -20 degrees

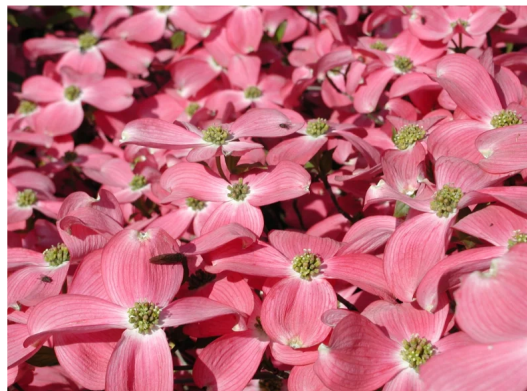
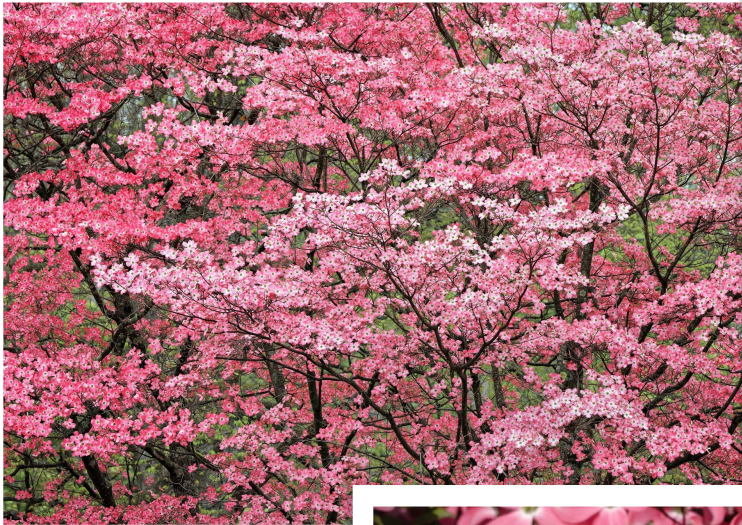
Pink Flowering Dogwood (*Cornus florida* 'rubra')

As the days lengthen and warm, creamy pink blooms with subtle highlights of red cover the tree and announce the arrival of spring.

When summer arrives the upward branching and deep green textured leaves provide an elegant and graceful appearance among larger straighter shade trees, evergreens, or the sharp geometry of your home. Swirling scarlet and purple leaves add to the color show in the fall, along with brilliant red berries that attract songbirds through the early winter.

Size 15 -30ft tall and wide in full sun to part shade

Hardy: -20 degree

Prairie Pink (*Cornus florida*)

Soft pink flowers appear in spring before the thick glossy leaves that are tatter resistant. It has an upright spreading growth habit. Turns a beautiful orange-red to purple-red in fall.

Size: 15 - 20ft tall and wide in full sun to part shade.

Hardy: -20 degrees

Eddie's White Wonder *Cornus kousa x nuttallii*

This unusual hybrid cross between our native Western dogwood, *Cornus nuttallii*, and the Eastern North American species, *Cornus florida*. The large flowers open in early spring and have broad overlapping bracts (false petals) that are gleaming white and abundant. The tree has a narrow frame and distinctive lax layered branching habit that works well in the garden and shows the blooms to their best advantage.

Size: 20ft tall x 15ft wide in 10 years but can reach a height of 30ft tall x 20ft wide at maturity.

Full sun to light or open shade

Hardy: 0 degrees

Chinese Dogwood *cornus kousa chinensis*

The Chinese Dogwood offers splendor year-round. It is a strong bloomer throughout the summer with oval, pointed dark green leaves with large, creamy-white flowers that bloom in June. In the autumn, it grows hanging red fruit while the leaves turn orange-red to red-scarlet shades for even greater appeal. In the winter, mature trees have bark that turns an attractive mottled, exfoliating, tan and gray. Plus, this heavy-fruited dogwood will attract lots of wildlife, including butterflies and birds.

Size: 30ft tall x 20-25ft wide.

Plant in full sun to part shade.

Hardy: -20 degrees plus

Greensleeves (*Cornus kousa*)

White flowers glow against the glossy, deep green leaves of this small tree in early summer. Fall brings an abundant crop of large red fruit that is a feast for the eyes and the birds, and the leaves turn brilliant shades of purple and red. Patchy, exfoliating bark adds year-round interest. Exhibiting the disease resistance characteristic of the species, 'Greensleeves' is a low maintenance charmer ideal for a site with some afternoon shade. Broad Upright

Size: 20'H x 15'W

Hardy: Zone: 5

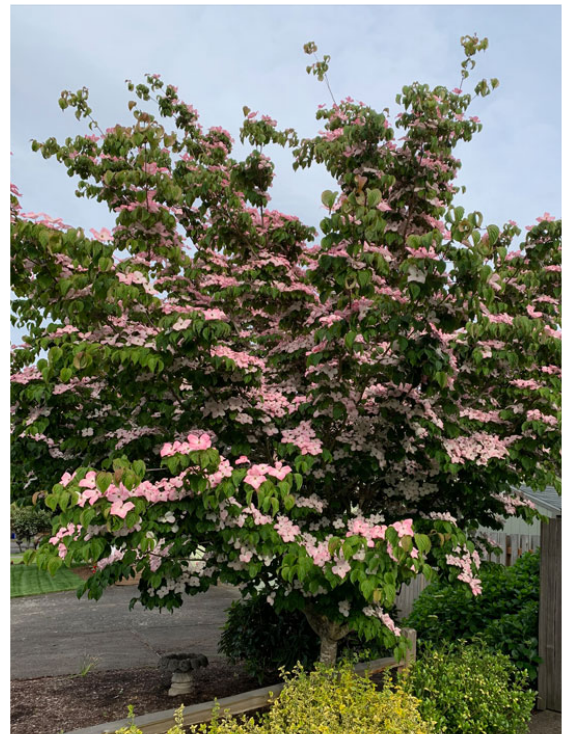
Heart Throb (*Cornus kousa*)

A magnificent flowering dogwood with rich pink flower bracts that last one to two months, much longer than other varieties, the deep pink hue is uncommon in this species; forms a small tree, ideal as an accent in the landscape. It features showy clusters of rose flowers with hot pink bracts held atop the branches from mid to late spring. It has bluish-green deciduous foliage. From early to mid fall it displays an abundance of magnificent pink berries. The pointy leaves turn an outstanding dark red in the fall. The peeling gray bark adds an interesting dimension to the landscape.

Size: 15 - 20ft tall x 15ft wide

Hardy: Zone 5, -20 degrees

Morning sun to afternoon shade

Milky Way *cornus kousa* var. *chinensis*

An upright, vase-shaped tree that develops strong horizontal branching with age. Huge, star-shaped, creamy white flowers bloom in early June, followed by raspberry-like fruits that will attract birds. Its deep green foliage turns purple-red in fall.

Grows: 20 to 25ft tall x 15 to 20ft wide

Full sun to part shade

Hardy: -20 degrees

Satomi Dogwood (*Cornus florida*)

The distinguishing characteristics of this dogwood is a gentle layered form, blooms that open white and transform into a luxurious pink, and red edible fruits. Kousa dogwoods have a later and longer bloom time and the flowers will last around 6 weeks from June to July. In the fall the fruit ripens and leaves turn a deep purplish red.

Size: 15 to 20 ft.tall and wide

Grows in full sun to part shade

Hardy: -20 degrees

Scarlet Fire (*Cornus kousa*)

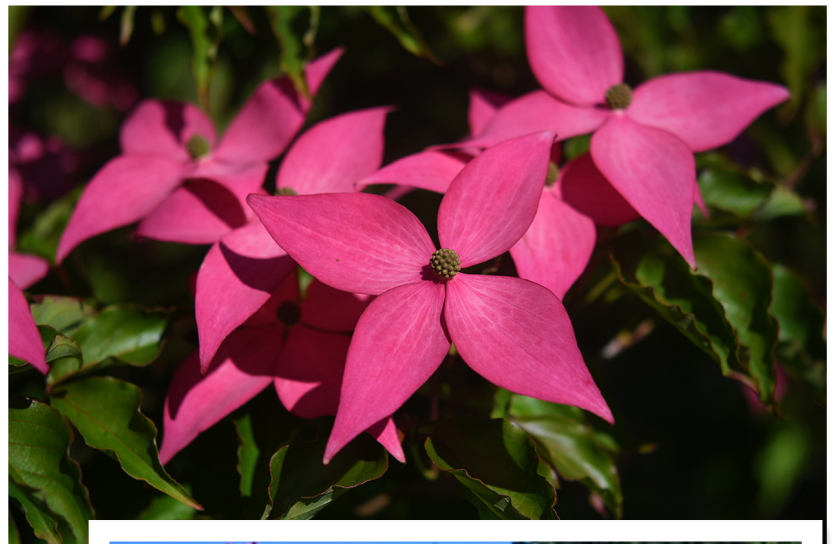
Featuring unique, dark pink to fuchsia blooms that span 4" to 5" (color is light pink for the first 1-2 years as the tree becomes well-established; best color results from placement in fertile soil and full sun) On top of its gorgeous color, it also has an unusually long flowering season, lasting for six to eight weeks in the springtime! The tree also has dark green leaves with purple streaks which contrast beautifully with the pink flowers. And in fall, the trees' leaves will transform into charming reds and oranges.

Size: 25ft tall x 20ft wide.

Full morning sun with afternoon shade

Hardy: Zone 5, -20 degrees.

Summer Fun (*Cornus kousa*)

3 season interest

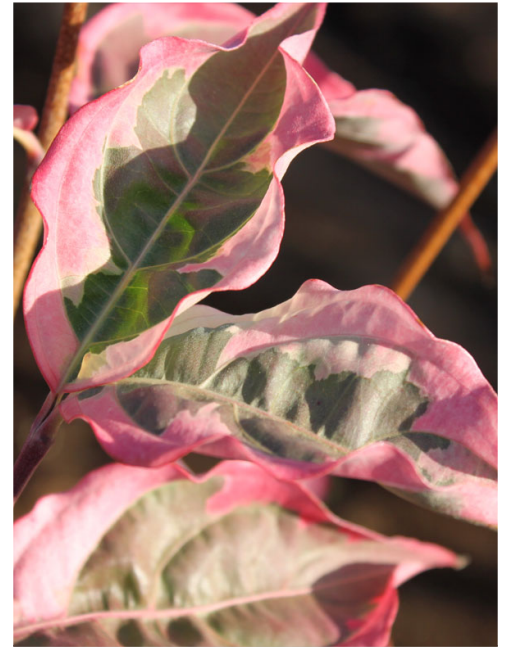
Lots of contrast to enjoy with variegated leaves that are green with bright white margins, displaying a pink edge when they first emerge. The white flower bracts in late spring are a pleasant complement to the brilliant foliage. Autumn temperatures make way for radiant red, orange and pink leaves.

Size: 18ft tall x 15ft wide with a broad upright form

Sun to partial shade

Hardy: Zone 5, -20 degrees

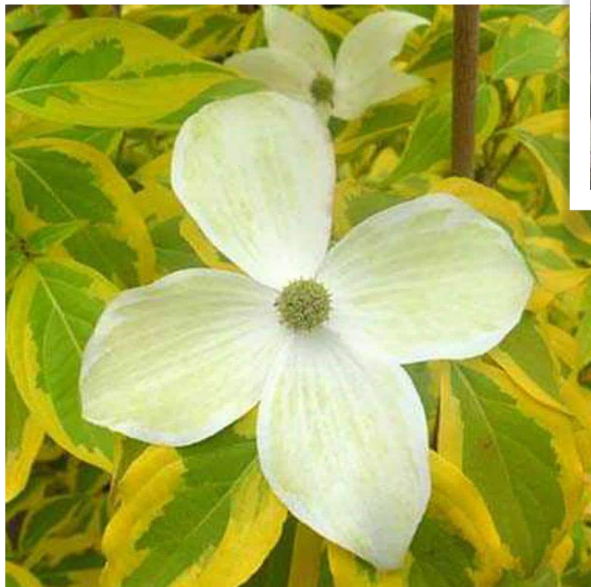
Summer Gold (*Cornus kousa*)

Add some vibrant color to your landscape with this exciting ornamental tree that will put on a spectacular parade of changing colors outside your window from spring to fall. In spring, apple-green leaves with wide yellow margins unfold, followed by sparkling white star-shaped flowers. In summer, you'll notice hints of pink in the foliage, and when the days turn brisk, the whole canopy flushes pink and purple, eventually deepening to red.

Size: 15ft tall and 15ft wide

Sun to Partial Shade

Hardy: Zone 5, -20 degrees

Venus (cornus kousa x nuttallii)

This tree is smothered in **LARGE**, stunning clusters of white flowers with white bracts held atop the branches in late spring. It has attractive dark green deciduous foliage. The pointy leaves are highly ornamental and turn an outstanding red in the fall. It features an abundance of magnificent red berries in late fall. The peeling gray bark and antique red branches are extremely showy and add significant winter interest.

Grows: 15 to 20ft tall x 18 to 20ft wide and taller over time
Full morning sun or filtered shade

Hardy: Zone 6, -10 degrees
