COMMANDER'S CORNER

Post 6024 Trustee, Harry Steelman, and your post-Commander, John Carson, attended the 124th VFW National Convention in Phoenix AZ. The outgoing Commander in Chief, Timothy Borland was the MC for most of the convention's main daily meetings. During these meetings the national award winners were introduced and presented their awards; thanks were given to the many corporate sponsors that made generous donations to veterans' causes; and a recap of the accomplishments of the VFW over the past year was presented including the passing of the PACT Act. At the congressional hearings, those asking for federal funding were allotted15 minutes to present to Congress their requests. When VFW Commander-in-Chief, Timothy Borland had his turn, he started speaking about the needs of the millions

of veterans. The committee was so engrossed in his presentation, he was not interrupted for one hour and a half. Then, he was invited back after lunch to complete his long presentation. It was because of this presentation that Congress passed the PACT Act Helping Veterans. Many of the rules, procedures, and bylaw changes were presented at the general meetings, and the assembled members got to vote on what was accepted as changes or rejected. When the new podium bylaws come out for 2023-2024, you will be able to see the numerous changes made.

Steelman and I attended several training sessions and got a lot of information on the rules and procedures concerning the VFW and how to run it properly. Space in the PostScript is limited, so I can't even start to explain all that was learned. We met and talked to VFW Veterans from all over the world. Notes were compared, and we came away knowing our post is on the right track, but it takes a lot of work. Sessions began at 08:00 hours, and you got back to your hotel around 18:00 hours. If you wanted to go and visit the surround-ing sights, you had to go early and/or stay late as the convention would take all your time. It was worth it. Plus you needed to make time for the hospitality room that allows you to meet and greet many fellow veterans.

In the end, Duane Sarmiento was elected Commander-in-Chief of the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the U.S. He served in the United States Navy from 1988 to 1997, and the United States Naval Reserve from 2002 to 2006, earning his VFW eligibility by serving in Operations Desert Shield/Storm.

Harry Steelman and I both came away impressed with how the National Convention was run and would strongly encourage any member interested in the VFW to attend a National Convention. You will come back with a better understanding of what it is we do and the feeling that it all is well worth it. The next National Convention will be in Kentucky.

National Desert Shield and Desert Storm Memorial: This new memorial in Washington DC was approved by Congress May 28, 2014 and a subsequent bill in March 2017 authorized the construction, without the use of federal funds, near the National Mall. The location will be just north of the Lincoln Memorial and west of the Vietnam Memorial. A groundbreaking ceremony occurred at the site on July 14, 2022. The design concept was approved by the Commission of Fine Arts in October 2022 and construction is expected to start in the fall of 2023 — actually a short timeline from approval to construction as Memorials go !



The stated goal of the Memorial is to create a deeply moving sequential experience for visitors that:

• Educates them about the historical events of the war

• Illustrates the historical significance of the 34-nation coalition that united to liberate Kuwait

• Reflects the unique environmental and battle conditions experienced by servicemen and women in this war

• Leaves visitors with an enduring memory of the historical significance and accomplishments of Desert Shield and Desert Storm
